

WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS REPORT SEPTEMBER 20, 2019

City Manager

- Signs and Elections Election season is here and the City Code has a few regulations regarding political signs. Political signs are not permitted in the public right-of-way, public water canals or on other public property or on any utility pole or tree, except within specified proximity of polling places on election day, under rules utilized by the Charlotte County Supervisor of Elections. Signs are limited to one per candidate or issue on any single parcel. Signs may located on private property, with permission of the owner. Signs cannot exceed 32 square feet in area per side and 6 feet in height. Signs may be placed a maximum of 45 days prior to the election (Sept. 22) and shall be removed within 5 days (Nov. 10) after the election.

- City Council Agenda The Sept. 18 City Council Highlights:
 - ✓ Approved legislative priorities proposed by Charlotte County for presentation to the Charlotte County Legislative Delegation that will take place on Oct. 8.
 - ✓ Approved change order for the Buckley's Pass seawall installation due to rock incurred during construction that was unforeseen during the bid process. The increased costs of \$289,025 are still within the overall estimate originally prepared by the Engineering Consultant.
 - ✓ Appropriated funds for bollards to be located around the mural along the Harborwalk under the US 41S Bridge to mitigate vandalism of the mural and safety concerns from users of the harborwalk.
 - ✓ Voted to forego federal dollars to construct Harborwalk West Area 3. This project is along Retta Esplanade from just west of Berry Street to Linear Park/tidal canal crossing. Proposed improvements include a multi-use pathway with decorative lighting, landscaping, site furnishings, and two foot bridges. Acceptance of federal funds brings along increased costs associated with both design and construction.
 - ✓ Encouraged Peace River Wildlife Center (PRWC) to create plans for relocation from Ponce de Leon Park to City-owned property on West Henry. Current plans call for relocation of the Wildlife Center onto one acre of land within Ponce Park.
 - ✓ Approved change order for Gilchrist Park Phase 2 based on previous Council rejection of the bid to complete the Harborwalk connection and park renovation as one project. Council directed staff to meet with the Engineer to determine an estimated cost for a new proposed scope & fee by pulling out the Harborwalk from the plans as an independent biddable project. The proposed cost is \$27,325 with a 91 day project timeline, prior to submittal to the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) for its review.

- **FY 2020 Budget** The final public hearing on the millage rate and overall budget was held on Sept. 18, 5:01pm in the City Council Chambers. - Shell Creek Questions have been raised about the spraying of the Shell Creek for weed control. This is a practice that has been put in place by the Florida Wildlife Commission and the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD). SWFWMD is responsible for maintain the creeks and reservoir. When the City of Punta Gorda treats the water, carbon is added to trap and remove any residual herbicide and other organic chemicals found in the raw creek water prior to treatment. The Water Plant tests the treated water annually for herbicides and pesticides and all results have been below the limits set by the United States Environmental Protection Association and Florida Department of Environmental Protection for drinking water.

Urban Design

- The Public Hearing before the Punta Gorda Planning Commission for the Citywide Master Plan Resolution is being withdrawn so additional comments can be made at the Oct. 2 City Council meeting. - In 2018, the City applied for and received the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's 2018-2019 Florida Resilient Coastlines: Resiliency Planning grant, administered by FDEP. The City contracted with Taylor Engineering, Inc. in Feb. 2019 to conduct a vulnerability analysis for city-owned critical infrastructure and prepare an addendum to the 2009 City of Punta Gorda Adaptation Plan with a Living Shoreline Element. The 2019 City of Punta Gorda Adaptation Plan Update is an addendum to the 2009 Plan. The Plan will be presented at the Oct. 2 City Council Meeting and at the Oct. 23 Planning Commission meeting. Public Works Department

Sanitation

• Yard Waste Collection – (Palm Fronds, Branches & Trimmings) Yard waste is collected once per week and must be out to the curb by 6 a.m. on the day of collection to guarantee pickup. Do not mix yard waste with regular household trash. Palm fronds, limbs, etc. shall not exceed 4" in diameter or 4' in length. These items must be tied and bundled for collection; bundles shall weigh no more than 35 pounds. Shrubbery, grass clippings and leaves must be placed at the curb in containers. Containers shall not exceed 32 gallons in size or 35 pounds in weight and must have handles. Biodegradable paper bags designated for yard waste collection are allowed. However, no plastic bags will be collected. The yard waste is made into mulch and the plastic products could contaminate the mulch. Any yard waste that is in a plastic bag will not be collected. If you have a large quantity or loose pile of yard waste, branches, stumps, etc., you will need to schedule a special collection either by visiting the Sanitation page on www.CityofPuntaGordaFL.com or by contacting the Public Works Department at (941) 575-5050. Lot clearing and whole tree removal is NOT part of your regular service. You must contact a tree removal company. SAFETY TIP! Do not place yard waste piles near or under power lines or trees, telephone boxes, mail boxes, fire hydrants, etc. This could impede access to the yard waste materials.

Engineering

- Veterans Park Phase II Stevens and Layton will begin work at Veteran's Park Phase II on Sept. 23.
- Alligator Creek Pedestrian Bridges along US41 NB-FDOT Right of Way Excavation, back fill continues with placement of bedding stone and the first layer of the segmental block wall. Materials sampling and testing is occurring. Erosion control measures and Maintenance of traffic devices are in place. Electrical and fiber utility conflicts were removed and will be re-installed at a later date. 6 US 41 NB roadway lights will be out temporarily

- Goldstein Street Bricking Party between Marion and Olympia Aves A Historic Street bricking party was successfully held Saturday, Sept. 14. Community volunteers and City staff completed the project. Clean up and final sweeping of sand will be done the week of Sept. 22.
- Citywide Drainage Swale Regrading To date JRL Underground has completed work at 488 properties totaling 360,000 square feet of grading/sodding. Work was completed this week at 301-335 Clusia Rosea. Work is underway at 7411-7417 S. Tulip Tree, and 701 Royal Poinciana. Work will then move to 550 Royal Poinciana and 618 Royal Poinciana.
- **Minor Paving** Beginning the week of Sept. 23 through Sept. 27 (weather and equipment operations permitting) maintenance milling and pavement resurfacing is scheduled at the northern leg of the Taylor Road and Carmalita intersection.

Canal Maintenance

- **Repairs** Crews filled 25 depressions and performed four seawall cap and seam patches.
- **Maintenance** Crews performed maintenance at Candia and Ponce de Leon Inlets.
- **Buckley's Pass** City Council approved Change Order 2 for rock seawall installation. Rock removal and seawall installation is ongoing.

Current Board & Committee Vacancies (Volunteer Appointment Information Form)

- Building Board (One alternate vacancy) Meets the 4th Tuesday at 9 a.m. in City Council Chambers City residency not required. Seven member board with two alternate members. Three year terms maximum of three terms. Four members must be involved with the building industry and three members must be consumer advocates who are not, nor ever have been, involved with building industry. Makes recommendations to City Council on the minimum qualifying requirements for obtaining Certificates of Competency in the various construction trades and the fees for same. Periodically reviews and holds public hearings on all building, electrical, plumbing, housing, gas, fire prevention and other related codes. Reviews enforcement of all codes relating to construction standards and acts as condemnation board in matters of violation of minimum standards. Hears alleged complaints.
- Utility Advisory Board (One regular vacancy) Meets the fourth Monday at 9 a.m. in City Council Chambers. Must be City resident. Seven member board. Three-year terms, maximum of two terms. Makes recommendations to City Council with regard to, but not limited to, revisions to the utility construction standards, alleged billing discrepancies and review of utility drawings.
- Burnt Store Isles Canal Advisory Committee (One regular vacancy) meets the second Tuesday at 1:30 p.m. in City Council Chambers. Must be resident of Burnt Store Isles. Five member board. Three year terms maximum of three terms. Makes recommendations to City Council on effective maintenance of existing canals, waterways and navigable channels within the district, together with the maintenance and reconstruction of seawalls. Holds public hearings and makes final decision on petitions for special permit to the provisions of Section 6-6(c) of the City Code.
