

## What's Up with That?



The fire department often receives calls for hydrants flowing or leaking water. There are a number of reasons why a hydrant could be discharging water such as damage or vandalism, but most of the time it is from normal operation. Hydrants throughout the city have an automatic flush device installed. This device is a red rectangular shaped box that is connected to one of the discharges. Since this device operates automatically, the hydrant is left open or "charged" and the water flows from the bottom of the flush device when activated. The device is programmed to flush the hydrant between 10pm to 4am and for 1 to 6 hours in duration.
