

# WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS REPORT DECEMBER 20, 2019

### City Manager

- Christmas and New Year's Day Holiday Closures The government offices of the City of Punta Gorda will be closed on Dec. 24, and Dec. 25, for the Christmas holiday and Jan. 1, for the New Year's holiday. The holiday closures WILL affect residential refuse, yard waste and recycling collections. It will also affect commercial customer collections. Residential services normally handled on Dec. 25 will be collected on Dec. 26. There are no changes to the Dec. 27 or Dec. 28 schedule. There will be no other changes to the sanitation schedule during Christmas or New Year's Holidays. - **Promoting Arts and Culture** Plan Punta Gorda 2019 Citywide Master Plan highlights arts and culture as not only reflecting the spirit and soul of a place, facilitating a sense of belong, but they are also an essential economic asset, attracting visitors and businesses who want to be a part of these authentic communities. Punta Gorda's unique history and thriving local arts and festival scene could become as much of a calling card for visitors as its beautiful setting and outdoor



recreation. The Plan goes on to state that investing in the arts has positive impacts on society, health and wellbeing, the economy and education.

How timely are the above comments from Dover Kohl in the Citywide Master Plan. The December 2019 issue of PM Magazine by the International City/County Management Association includes an article regarding the importance of the arts using cultural assets for neighborhood revitalization and increased economic sustainability. According to the U.S. Department of Commerce's Bureau of Economic Analysis, in 2016, arts and culture contributed \$804 billion to the economy, or 4.3% of the gross domestic product. Such industries as construction and agriculture contributed less. According to Americans for the Arts Arts & Economic Prosperity Study, the nonprofit arts contributed \$27.5 billion to state and local government coffers. Given that nationally, all levels of government collectively invest around \$5 billion in nonprofit arts, this ends up being more than a 5-to-1 return on investment. The healthier and more vibrant a locality's nonprofit arts sector, the more the locality will collect in tax revenue.

Starting in 2018, a not-for-profit organization, Harborside Center for the Arts (HCA), was created to promote arts in Punta Gorda and establish a new Community Arts Center that would not only house the Punta Gorda Symphony Orchestra and visiting theatre and musical productions, but also serve the broader community with additional spaces for exhibition, cultural production and arts education. HCA is currently working on feasibility analyses for a new community arts center. The Citywide Master Plan includes a concept plan of what that development might look like in the downtown area. If successful in a downtown location, HCA would generate a combination of earned, contributed and endowment revenues.

- Community Redevelopment Area The application period for the CRA vacancy has closed. The Charlotte County Commission will make their nomination at their Jan. 14 meeting. The four applicants are Bill Dryburgh, Wendy Mueller, Drew Rossi and George Rucht. The City should have the letter of nomination in time for the Jan. 22 Council Agenda.
- City of Punta Gorda 1% Sales Tax Committee On Jan. 13 the Sales Tax Committee will reconvene at 1 p.m. at the Charlotte Harbor Events Center. The group will hear and score the remaining City proposals and the projects that came from the Request for Proposal responses from community organizations. The RFP responses include:

### **Engineering**

- Paving Schedule Temporary striping has been placed with permanent striping to be scheduled for placement. The contractor anticipates completion of the punch list by Dec. 20. Permanent striping will occur in Jan.
- Veterans Park Phase II All stucco work is complete. The contractor has installed light pole foundations. Gazebo floor removal is complete and installation of flooring will be completed over the next week.
- Alligator Creek Pedestrian Bridge (US 41 NB FDOT Right-of-Way) Erosion control, excavation and grading continues. Installations of railing, electrical, wall coping formwork concrete placement continues. The project is greater than 60% complete and on schedule for completion on or before Feb. 2019. The contractors work zone encompasses the multi-use trail over Alligator Creek parallel to US41 NB. The multi-use trail will remain closed to pedestrians and cyclists until further notice.
- Citywide Drainage Swale Regrading To date JRL Underground has completed work at 569 properties totaling 430,600 square feet of grading/sodding. Work is underway in Burnt Store Isles and during the week of Dec. 23 will include several locations along Bordeaux Drive.
- Intersection ADA Improvements The contractor has demolished and placed concrete at the following ADA ramp locations: Myrtle and Narranja, Hazel and Myrtle, Ida and Cooper, Showalter and Mary, Showalter and Cooper, Fitzhugh and Booth, Booth and Virginia, E Helen and Mary and E. Helen and Milus. ADA mat placement will occur after concrete curing.
- Madrid Blvd. and US 41 Sidewalk Improvements The bid opening will be Dec. 20. Procurement will review the submittals and determine the low responsible bidder prior to the recommendation for award.

#### **Canal Maintenance**

- Seawall Replacement Projects
  - Marine Contracting Group has completed two of the 37 seawalls in PGI with four seawalls under construction.
- Crews filled 29 depressions.
- Seawall Assessment Program The Seawall Assessment Program has started in the PGI canals beginning at Sancho Panza and working up the Tarpon Inlet. Staff will be inspecting all seawalls by boat and collecting data utilizing GPS (Global Positioning System) equipment. The inspection is performed with the input of the exact locations on a computerized map as well as the condition data for each segment of wall & cap. The completion of the annual assessment allows the division to continue to forecast the estimated wall and cap longevity and create future work programs. This work is accomplished during low winter tides and expected to be completed by Feb.

### **Buckley's Pass Additional Harbor Access**

• Dredging of the pass is ongoing. The canal between Almar Drive and River Bay Drive will be closed to through traffic during dredging operations. Boaters should use caution when operating in the area. Trucking of dredge spoils from Casey Key Drive to the Colony Point Drive spoil site continues.
