## **City Manager**

- Laishley Park Playground The Community Redevelopment Authority (CRA) will look at options for the replacement of playground equipment in Laishley Park. The options include:
  - ➤ Increasing the playground and surfacing budget
  - > Converting playground space to a covered picnic pavilion

- January Strategic Plan Update City Council adopted the Strategic Plan for FY 2020 on Oct. 2, 2019. ## **Zoning and Code Compliance**

- **Right-of-Way** Code Compliance is continuing to address the violations of signs being placed in the right-of-way. The following will take place:
  - 1. Staff will continue to work periodic weekends covering as much of the City as possible
  - 2. Removal and disposal of any signs that are in violation of the City Code (garage sales, open house signs, etc.)
    - i. If a generic sign is found it will not initiate a Code case as no information may be obtained. The sign will be removed and disposed.
    - ii. When a sign has an address or contact info (ie realtor, address agent Company etc) staff will take photos document and initiate an irreparable violation code case which will be presented to the Code Enforcement Board. This allows a fine of up to \$5,000.00 per sign as each sign is a separate violation.
  - 3. Note that some signs (garage sales & open house) may require staff to cite the property/homeowners for the placement in the R-O-W.
  - 4. Proper documentation for a code case hearing will take additional time for staff to process.


#### **Engineering** -

- **ADA Interior Signage and Wayfinding** A Change Order for missing signs is in process along with a time extension for production and completion of sign installations. This project is 98% complete.
- ADA Ramp Improvements The contractor is near complete at the following intersections: Showalter at Milus and Fitzhugh at Mary. To be completed are placment of the ADA mats and sod. To date this will complete 14 intersection ADA ramp updates.
- Alligator Creek pedestrian bridges along US 41 NB-FDOT Right of Way Pay Application four and the FDOT reimbursement request is in process. The contractor is installing handrail, the lights have been installed and electrical work is occurring. Sod is complete. Coordination with FPL is occurring to schedule placement of a service pole and power connection.





**Boater's Beware** – This winter we are experiencing some extreme low tides. combine that with a northern wind and even more water is pushed out of the canals. It can be a challenge navigating through the canal system without proper planning. Canal Maintenance has received some calls from boaters that frequently use Ponce inlets are hitting bottom. Even though the channel markers are 50' to 70' apart, the navigational width of the Ponce inlet is only 20' wide. Below please

- City wide Drainage Swale regrading To date JRL Underground has completed work at 626 properties totaling 468,275 square feet of grading/sodding. Work areas during the week of Feb. 3 will include work that is underway at 4000-4040 Maltese Ct., 636 Maltese Dr. and then will move to 4001-4029 San Massimo Dr.
- Consolidated Ice Plant City staff relocated rock remant from the Consolidated Ice Plant. The Consolidated Ice Plant was a large structure on Berry Street that was demolished in the early nineteen hundreds and was the second largest ice plant in the United States.







# Consolidated Ice Plant

Located on Blocks 26 & 50 of the Trabue Plat 1903 to 1914

This block of concrete is a foundation remnant of the Consolidated Ice Manufacturing, Refrigeration and Fish Co., which once occupied two full city blocks. Built in 1903 to supply cooling for fish products, the ice plant was the second largest in the country. The company produced only one 96-ton run of ice before declaring bankruptcy in January, 1904. Tragedy struck the ruins in 1908 when a 4-year-old boy was killed by a falling timber. In 1914, the city took the property by eminent domain & demolished the ruins. Bricks from the demolition were donated to First United Methodist Church (507 W Marion Ave) for construction of the sanctuary.

- Harborwalk 2A City staff are reviewing the draft bid solication documents.
- Madrid Sidewalk Construction The contractor has mobilized to the site and commenced with excavation. Pipe has been delivered on site. The work area is from the western drive of the Burnt Store Publix Plaza to US 41 SB. This project is scheduled to be completed by the end of May 2020. 
- Sailfish Bridge Construction Effective Jan. 29 for approximately 30 days. Sailfish Bridge will be under construction to repair erosion damage under the bridge. Sailfish Bridge is also known as the 2nd Bridge on Marion Avenue and is located between Gulfview Road and Maria Court. Boat passage will be restricted Monday through Friday between 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Boats will be allowed to pass three times during the workday 9 a.m., noon and 3 p.m. If any boats are waiting to pass at these times, the contractor will cease operations and allow boats to pass. The contractor will be issuing weekly updates throughout the project to notify boaters should there be breaks in the work schedule where boats can pass more freely. The passage will be fully open weekdays from 6 p.m. until 7 a.m. and all day and night on weekends. Vehicle traffic should be unaffected. The contractor has revised the completion date for concrete and paver installation to Feb. 12 with overall substantial completion of the project to Feb. 25.



- Seawall Assessment Program The Seawall Assessment is ongoing; staff has collected over 6,413 points to date. Crews are currently working in the Bird Section of Punta Gorda Isles. Seawall Assessment is expected to be completed by the end of February.
- Seawall Replacement Projects
  - ➤ The seawall replacement contractor has completed seven seawall replacement projects and has three projects under construction in PGI and 1 under construction in BSI. A seawall replacement project is not considered complete until the sod has been placed.
  - > Crews filled depressions at 18 locations.
  - > Crews performed six seawall cap and seam patches (26' linear ft.)
  - > Crews removed one piece of debris from canal
  - Crews posted one sign at Sailfish bridge

operations are nearing completion in the canal along Sea Edge Drive. Boaters NEED to stay out of the new pass until construction is completed which is scheduled to occur in April. Damage to vessel propulsion systems is very likely to occur if they enter the pass. The canals between Almar Drive and River Bay Drive and Sea Edge Drive will be closed to through traffic during dredging operations. Boaters should use caution when operating near the construction area. Trucking of dredge spoils from Casey Key



Drive to the Colony Point Drive spoil site continues. Residents NEED to stay out of the Colony Point Drive spoil site and off of the spoil piles. Heavy equipment is being used in the area and injury is likely to occur.

• Honoring a Punta Gorda Police Department Hero – On Jan. 29, 1903, City Marshal John Bowman was murdered in front of his wife and four children when a suspect fired a shotgun through the front window of Marshal Bowman's home. The suspect shot Bowman as revenge for his tough stance against drinking and gambling. The suspect was arrested and sentenced to death, but the sentence was later commuted to life in prison. The men and women of the Punta Gorda Police Department will always remember the sacrifice Marshal Bowman made to our community.

### **Fire Department**

• The Dangers of Canned (Compressed) Air – There are many brands of this commonly used item in homes and offices. It is canned air, used to clean dust from equipment such as computers, phones, keyboards, printers, shredders and more. Although these products are often used without causing any incident, they can be dangerous. Canned air when not properly used has been known to cause flash fires and injuries. Canned air when used improperly has also been known to cause frostbite, asphyxiation and toxicity. Canned air is not just air. It is made of gas that is compressed into a liquid and canned. The following safety precautions (along with all provided instructions) should be considered before using any type of compressed air:



- ➤ Make sure the area where it is used is properly ventilated.
- Read the entire label:
  - ✓ If it is flammable, switch to a nonflammable alternative
  - ✓ Determine whether use of eye, face, or skin protection is needed
- Make sure all users read the entire label and follow all instructions for proper use
- ➤ Keep Material Safety Data Sheets available for complete information
