City Manager

 City Manager Column – To say my first six months as City Manager have been eventful would be an understatement. From getting to know many of the talented staff members at the city to meeting the wonderful people that lead the businesses and organizations in the community my days and evenings have flown by. Much has been accomplished in this short time thanks to the leadership of City Council and our dedicated staff.



The Chapter Six Code rewrite was approved by City Council. The rewrite updated and added clarity to the provisions that govern the

waterways in Punta Gorda. Several Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) projects have been completed. ADA improvements to the restroom facilities and kitchen areas of the City Hall Annex were finished. An ADA ramp was installed at Laishley Park for improved access for all.

Multiple parks projects reached fruition. The Harborwalk, from the gazebo to Berry Street, now welcomes visitors to view Charlotte Harbor in Gilchrist Park. The Gilchrist Park playground was resurfaced to provide a safe environment for children to play. The fishing pier at Gilchrist Park decking replacement took place. Seawall repairs and replacements wrapped up at Ponce de Leon Park to protect the land from erosion. Public Works completed a street rebricking project. Sullivan Street is beautifully redone with historic bricks. Public Works has also ordered four new refuse trucks to aid in the efficient provision of waste management services. The city launched Text My Gov for visitors and residents to access information by texting (941) 347-0747. The Small Business Spotlight was created to share the stories of local businesses.

The Punta Gorda Police Department launched their award winning Veteran's Crisis Assistance Team. Providing an extra level of customer service to those that have served our country. The Punta Gorda Fire Department (PGFD) has played a huge role in providing vaccines to our residents and will continue to do so into the foreseeable future. They have also undergone extensive training in a variety of areas. The PGFD has also placed an order for a new aerial fire truck.

The 1% Sales Tax was approved that has allowed the city to move forward with the renovation of Historic City Hall. Space has been acquired for the relocation of the Clerk's Office and Finance Departments during construction. Progress has also been made on the Comprehensive Plan and Form Based Codes. City Council has also authorized a traffic study for the area of 41 north bound in downtown Punta Gorda.

- Candidate Packets Now Available Candidate packets for the 2021 City General Election are now available through the City Clerk's Office, City Hall, 326 West Marion Avenue. The 2021 General Election will take place on Nov. 2 and will include City Council District 3 and 5. Councilmembers serve a two (2) year term and are elected at-large. Only opposed candidate races will appear on the ballot. If more than two candidates seek election for any one district seat, a primary election must be held on Aug. 17 (11 weeks prior to the General Election). Qualifying for the 2021 General Election cycle begins, Jun. 7 at noon and ends on Jun. 11 at noon. - Florida Power and Light Update Florida Power and Light pulled an additional 13 poles in the past week. Some of their work has slowed down so that Comcast can catch up with relocation of wires off of the old poles. There are an additional 37 poles that have other company wires still attached to them, which all need to be moved before the old poles can be removed.
- Comcast Update Comcast has relocated wires on an additional 20 poles, and cleaned up messy wires on 80 additional poles, leaving approximately 60 more to do. Emphasis has been on poles in Punta Gorda Isles this week.

Public Works

Administration

• Citizens' Academy Public Works Session – Public Works held their session of the Citizens' Academy this week. The Director explained the responsibilities, functions and roles of each division within Public Works. Participants were given a tour of the Public Works Campus along with demonstrations by Canal Maintenance, Right-of-Way and Sanitation. Canal Maintenance showed participants how a seawall panel is made and displayed the muck truck that is used in resident's yards. Right-of-Way showed participants how a pothole is patched and vacuumed a storm drain with the Vactor truck. Sanitation emptied a dumpster and answered questions regarding trash removal.

Canal Maintenance

- Seawall Replacement Projects The seawall replacement contractor has six projects under construction and twelve projects completed in Punta Gorda Isles. There are 26 seawall replacement projects scheduled for Punta Gorda Isles. All seawall replacement projects in Burnt Store Isles have been completed. A seawall project is not considered complete until the sod has been placed.
 - Crews filled depressions at 15 locations.
 - > Crews patched/repaired 79' linear feet of seawall cap/seams.
 - > Crews removed and replaced 4' linear feet of damaged culvert/storm drain pipe which extended through the seawall.

Parks and Grounds

• **Hounds on Henry Dog Park** – Bahia sod continues to take root at the Hounds on Henry Dog Park. The areas with snow fence will continue to be closed to the Public. The remainder of the dog park will remain open to the Public.

Right-of-Way

• Olympia Avenue Lane Closure – The project has been completed.

Engineering

- Palm Avenue Between Chasteen Street to McGregor Street Road Closure – The project has been completed and the road is now open to traffic. The sand and hay bales will be removed by Apr. 30.
- City Wide Drainage Swale Regrading All piping has been installed and sodding has been completed on Terin Court. The catch basin will be installed within the next few weeks on Terin Court. Work has begun on Macedonia Drive.



- **King Street Survey and Plan** The survey work is in process to determine existing topography and actual City right-of-way limits. Anticipated deliverables are due mid-Apr.
- Madrid Boulevard Warranty Work The warranty work is complete with the exception of the placement of thermoplastic striping scheduled within the next two weeks. Single lane closures are to be anticipated while work is performed. Travelers are requested to use extreme caution while workers are present in the right of way and allow additional time for travel. Temporary delays are to be anticipated. - Adrienne Street Pier The pier has been lifted, and pile jacket installation is in progress. The pier will be closed to the public while work is being performed.

Police

- Pedestrian Rules With miles and miles of parks and recreational trails, Punta Gorda is a great place to get outside and take a walk, but please remember there are laws that apply to pedestrians.
 - ➤ When crossing at an intersection with a traffic signal, pedestrians should follow any pedestrian signal provided.
 - ➤ If a pedestrian signal is unavailable, pedestrians should follow the traffic signal and only cross when the light is green.



- ➤ When a sidewalk is available, pedestrians must use it and are prohibited from walking in the roadway.
- ➤ If a sidewalk is not available, pedestrians walking in the roadway shall, when practicable, walk only on the left shoulder facing traffic coming from the opposite direction.

- **Police Officer Testing** The police department is currently accepting applications for the position of Police Officer. • **Did you know?** – The Punta Gorda Fire Department has a volunteer program which helps to inspire and educate people interested in pursuing a career in the Fire and EMS world. The Punta Gorda Fire department volunteers meet every second and fourth Monday evening of each month. The department can accommodate up to 15 active volunteers on the roster. After their meetings they train on the skills and abilities of being a Firefighter/EMT. They also contribute a minimum of 24 hours of volunteer time riding with the paid members of the department.  also began installing cover plates.






Water Distribution

Marion Ave. This is work is scheduled for Apr. 19 starting at 11 p.m. until approximately 1 a.m., Apr. 20.

Current Board and Committee Vacancies (Volunteer Appointment Information Form)

- **Board of Zoning Appeals** (Two alternates) Meets the fourth Tuesday at 4 p.m. in City Council Chambers. City residency required. Seven member board with two alternate members. Three year terms, maximum of three terms. Financial disclosure required. Makes recommendations to City Council on variances to City Code.
- **Donation Review Committee** (representative of non-profit organization related to history of City) Meets quarterly, as needed, immediately following meetings of the Historic Preservation Advisory Board. Five member board. Three of the total five members will be appointed from the Historic Preservation Advisory Board membership. Reviews nonmonetary donations received by the City and recommends acceptance or rejection of same.
- **Utility Advisory Board** Meets the fourth Monday at 9 a.m. in City Council Chambers. Must be City resident. Seven-member board. Three-year terms, maximum of two terms. Makes recommendations to City Council with regard to, but not limited to, revisions to the utility construction standards, alleged billing discrepancies and review of utility specifications.
- **Building Board** (consumer advocate position) Meets the 4th Tuesday at 9 a.m. in City Council Chambers City residency not required. Seven-member board with two alternate members. Three-year terms. Maximum of three terms OR partial term plus two more terms. Four members must be involved with the building industry and three members must be consumer advocates who are not, nor ever have been, involved with building industry.
