

## Weekly Highlights Report April 30, 2021

### **City Manager**

• City Manager Column – This has been a month of great focus on the topic of policing. I think it is appropriate to share the message of our Punta Gorda Police Department (PGPD) Chief Pam Davis regarding the verdict of former police officer Derrick Chauvin found guilty of the murder of Mr. George Floyd. "...As I previously stated when this tragic incident happened, this individual tarnished the law enforcement profession with his blatant disregard for human life. On behalf of the men and women of the PGPD, I want to assure our community that we will continue to earn your trust. We believe in the sanctity of human life. It is at the core of our department along with our organizational values: Integrity, Respect, Fairness and



Impartiality, Excellence, and Teamwork. We will continue to embrace the efforts to move policing forward alongside *all* members of our community." Also, the PGPD has recently released the quarterly crash analysis. This is created to be proactive in reducing the number of crashes that occur yearly. The data is used as a resource for identification of problem areas and recommendations for public education and or enforcement actions. In total there were 194 crashes this quarter within the city. 86 of these crashes were at intersections. Another 64 occurred at some other area of a roadway that is not an intersection. Parking lot crashes accounted for 44 of the reported incidents. The parking lot crashes are noted but not broken down by location. The total of crashes increased by nine over the first quarter of 2020.

The intersections with the most crashes, five in total, were West Marion Avenue at Cross Street and West Marion Avenue at Maud Street. Cross Street at West Retta Esplanade, East Marion Avenue at Tamiami Trail, and Taylor Street at West Charlotte Avenue each saw four crashes. Tamiami Trail at Aqui Esta Drive, Tamiami Trail at Taylor Road, West Marion Avenue at Goldstein Street and West McKenzie Street all saw three crashes in the first quarter. Of these crashes occurring at intersections eight of these crashes were rear end collisions. Other causes included failure to yield the right of way, side swiping parked cars, and turning in to vehicles.

This information will be used by the PGPD for enforcement related actions and educational purposes. Some of the tools our officers use to obtain voluntary compliance of traffic laws include the use of unmanned line vehicles, unmarked patrol units, speed radar trailers and directed traffic patrols. I encourage all of our residents and visitors to utilize defensive driving skills such as keeping a safe following distance, avoiding distractions, and when in doubt yield.

Our PGPD staff and Volunteers in Policing will continue to provide the highest level of professional police services. Every member of the agency serves with pride, integrity, fairness, respect, compassion, and dedication. The team strives to deliver outstanding customer service while partnering with the community they protect and serve. Thank you for all you do to focus on the safety of our residents and visitors and don't forget to lock your doors

- Candidate Packets Now Available Candidate packets for the 2021 City General Election are now available through the City Clerk's Office, City Hall, 326 West Marion Avenue. The 2021 General Election will take place on Nov. 2 and will include City Council District 3 and 5. Councilmembers serve a two (2) year term and are elected at-large. Only opposed candidate races will appear on the ballot. If more than two candidates seek election for any one district seat, a primary election must be held on Aug. 17 (11 weeks prior to the General Election). Qualifying for the 2021 General Election cycle begins, Jun. 7 at noon and ends on Jun. 11 at noon. - Florida Power and Light (FPL)/Comcast Update FPL reports that to date, they have removed a total of 254 abandoned poles. They have now dedicated a team of people who will exclusively work on this project to keep things moving forward. They have identified another 141 poles that need to still be pulled, 23 that still have FPL attachments on them and the rest are Comcast and other utilities. Comcast is scheduled to move wires on 84 more poles. They have one team working on this full time now. On Bal Harbor, FPL identified 43 locations where double poles needed to be pulled, 22 are done and 21 remain. Of those, 7 are ready to pull and 14 still have attached wires on them. On Marion, 7 double poles were identified, three have been removed and four remain with wires on them. On Aqui Esta, 21 double poles were identified, 11 have been removed and 10 are still left, seven of which still have attached wires on them. Also, FPL has started to restore some of the sites that have recently had new handhole boxes placed beside the new poles. They are now going back through and cleaning up the areas around the boxes and filling in with fill dirt and sod. They are working in the bird section this week.

#### **Urban Design**

#### • The Planning Corner- Sign Code

The sign code draft was reviewed at the Apr. 26 Planning Commission meeting. The intent and purpose is to adopt a sign code which, through a comprehensive system of reasonable, effective, consistent, **content-neutral**, and non-discriminatory standards and regulations, provides for consistency and the public health, safety and welfare of the community. Content neutral means signs can only be regulated by size, location and number of signs per parcel. The main changes proposed with the sign code re-write include but are not limited to the following:

- ➤ Proposed <u>residential</u> yard signs/flags:
- o 4 signs per parcel
- o 4 square feet in area
- > Proposed commercial freestanding signs:
- o 4 signs per acre
- o 32 square feet in area

City Council will consider approval of the first reading of the sign code draft at the May 19 Council meeting. Community input is always accepted and appreciated.





#### **Public Works**

#### **Canal Maintenance**

Sail and Power Squadron has volunteered to inspect City maintained channel markers. They located and verified the Global Positioning System coordinates (latitude and longitude) of each channel marker and compared the data with the United States Coast Guard Light List - any discrepancies will be reported for correction. Each sign has been inspected, inventoried and photographed.



 Seawall Replacement Projects – The seawall replacement contractor has six projects under construction and 13 projects completed in Punta Gorda Isles. There are 26 seawall replacement projects scheduled for Punta Gorda Isles. All seawall replacement projects in Burnt Store Isles

have been completed. A seawall project is not considered complete until the sod has been placed.

- Crews filled depressions at 15 locations and repaired a seawall panel seam at one location.
- Crews installed a rip rap driveway extension at the spoil site (located on Colony Point) to prevent dirt from tracking onto the roadway.



#### **Engineering**

- Adrienne Street Pier After further assessment, the pier will remain closed to the public for additional work.
- City Wide Drainage Swale Regrading Installation of a catch basin at 3507 Terin Court as
  well as grading and sodding at 685-699 Macedonia Drive is complete. Grading and sodding is
  underway in Burnt Store Meadows at several locations including along Royal Poinciana, North
  Tulip Tree and Allamanda Lane.
- **King Street Survey and Plan** The survey work is in process to determine existing topography and actual City right-of-way limits. We are awaiting final review of deliverables by the surveyor.
- Madrid Boulevard Warranty Work The placement of thermoplastic striping is complete.
- Pavement Rejuvination The week of May 3 through May 7 (weather and equipment operations permitting) the contractor will begin with placement of public notification door hangers, roadway signage placement and the application of the pavement rejuvenation product on the following streets: Deborah Drive from Bal Harbor Boulevard to the cul-de-sac; Padre Island Drive from Carmichael Drive to the cul-de-sac; Charlotte Amalie Court from Deborah Drive to the cul-de-sac; Crooked Island Drive from Ryan Boulevard to the cul-de-sac; and Socorro Drive from Aqui Esta Drive to the cul-de-sac. The road will be open to local traffic only. Detours and impact to traffic are to be anticipated. Hours of operation will be between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. When driving in the area, motorists are encouraged to drive with extreme caution and be alert for workers in the right-of-ways. Gift cards are nearly impossible to trace and the chances of identifying the scammer and returning the money spent on them is very low. 
#### **Fire Department**
