

Weekly Highlights Report May 21, 2021

City Manager

• City Manager Column – Last week I had the pleasure of speaking at the Punta Gorda Chamber of Commerce's Business over Breakfast. It was great to see so many business leaders starting their day at the Four Points Sheraton with networking and plenty of opportunity for information sharing and engaging questions. Thank you for allowing me the opportunity to be there with you. Two of the hot topics of this week are the public hearing for the Planned Use Development (PD) for the property located at 33 and 55 Tamiami Trail and updating of the sign code.



There have been some questions about the public hearing notice posted for the property that currently includes TT's Tiki Bar. The City of Punta Gorda Planning Commission and Council will consider an amendment to the approved PD which will allow the applicant to continue to operate the existing Tiki Bar, increase the size or number of restroom trailers, increase or replace the temporary kitchen trailer or structure, retain sand volley ball courts that may be replaced with a deck and fourth Tiki Hut, and continue to use the open grass area for events. The Planning Commission public hearing will take place on May 24 at 2 p.m. The City Council public hearing will be at 9 a.m. on June 16.

Approval of this amendment to the PD benefits the City of Punta Gorda by eliminating the need for an ongoing series of temporary use permits and instead utilizes the existing PD by adopting appropriate conditions for interim uses, thereby retaining a popular waterfront destination. It will be up to the property owner/developer to determine if the use will remain in the same place/configuration at the time of the multi-family development. Any deviation from the approved PD site plan for the multi-family development would require another amendment to the PD. The original PD was approved for the hotel and multi-family development in 2006.

On May 18 City Council considered approval of a new sign ordinance. The City Attorney has recommended that the City's sign code be amended to provide for specific content-neutral regulation. The intent and purpose is to promote the public health, safety and welfare through a comprehensive system of reasonable, effective, consistent, content-neutral, and nondiscriminatory sign standards and requirements.

The draft ordinance has been updated based upon comments by Planning Commission, City Council, business owners and residents. These include limiting the size of residential flags to 24 square feet in area. It adds setback and landscape requirements for permanent ground signs as well. The new ordinance also contains definitions and regulations regarding fighting words, indecent and obscene language on signs or flags. Yard signs may be a maximum of four square feet in area and three feet in height. The placement of signs must be a minimum of 10 feet from the edge of pavement. Four signs are allowed per parcel. There is no time limit on signs. For residential flag poles 40 feet is the max pole height. Two poles are allowed on a parcel. Two flags are permitted per pole. Flags are counted toward maximum number of yard signs. Faded tattered or torn flags are prohibited.

Thank you to the staff from Urban Design, Zoning and Code Compliance, and the City Attorney, for the diligent work in preparing these two items for City Council consideration. City staff continues to preserve our small-town character while promoting diversity, economic development and sustainability

• General Election 2021

Qualifying week is fast approaching! The 2021 General Election will take place on Nov. 2, and will include City Council District 3 and 5. Qualifying for the 2021 General Election cycle begins Jun. 7 at noon and ends on Jun. 11 at noon.

To Qualify as a Candidate

To become a qualified candidate, you must be a "filed candidate" and complete the following:

- 1. File Form DS-DE 9
- 2. File Form DS-DE 84, Statement of Candidate, within ten days of filing Form DS-DE 9 (F.S. 106.023). By filing this form the candidate acknowledges they have been provided access to read and understand the requirements of Chapter 106, F.S., a copy of which is included in the Candidate Packet.
- 3. Submit **CE Form 1**, Statement of Financial Interests (F.S. 99.061(5) & 112.3145(2)(a)).
- 4. Subscribe to a candidate's oath in writing by filing **Form DS-DE 302NP**, Candidate Oath Nonpartisan Office (F.S. 99.021(1)(a)).
- 5. Pay an **election assessment fee** equal to 1% of the salary of the office being sought (must be paid prior to the end of the qualifying period) (F.S. 99.093 (1)).
- 6. During the qualifying period obtain the signatures on the prescribed **petition form** of at least 25, but not more than 50, registered voters who reside within the district for which election is sought (City Charter).

Note: The petition form must be obtained from the City Clerk's Office during the week of May 31 (offices closed Memorial Day) and will only be provided to filed candidates.

• **Purple Heart Plaza** – The pavers at the Purple Heart Plaza located in Veterans Park have been installed. Approximately 30 pavers are currently being engraved and will be added at a later date.



• The Planning Corner – Sign Code –

The First Reading of the sign code re-write was approved by City Council at the May 19 Council meeting. Some amendments were made to the ordinance presented to City Council:

- Prohibited signs containing indecent, fighting words or obscene language or graphics:
 - Will include signs/flags on vehicles, vessels or apparel
- ➤ Residential flag size:
 - o Limited to 24 square feet in area
 - o Exception, one flag on the property may be a maximum of 60 square feet in area
- > Signs/Flags on boats which are on a lift or in the water:
 - o Exempt from total sign/flag count allowed on residential properties
 - Not exempt from the prohibition of fighting words, indecent or obscene language or graphics

Building Deparment

- General Updates -
 - ➤ As of Apr. 30 Building has conducted 4917 building inspections this fiscal year.
 - ➤ During the month of Apr. 20 single family homes were permitted for a fiscal year to date total of 82.
 - ➤ With the start of our rainy season approaching increased job site inspections will be implemented to identify storm water runoff issues on open construction sites. Contractors will be notified of any items needing correction and follow up inspections will be done.
 - ➤ Building has received the plans for Parkside Apartments and will begin preliminary plan review of a 297 unit apartment complex to be located at Jones Loop Road and Burnt Store Road.

Public Works

Canal Maintenance

- Seawall Replacement Projects The seawall replacement contractor has nine projects under construction and 14 projects completed in Punta Gorda Isles. There are 26 seawall replacement projects scheduled for Punta Gorda Isles. All seawall replacement projects are completed for Burnt Store Isles this fiscal year.  - ➤ Crews filled depressions at 22 locations.
 - > Crews patched/repaired nine linear feet of seawall cap/seams.
 - > Crews removed one large piling from the waterway.
 - > Crews performed sonar reading at Bass and Snook inlet waterway channels.
- Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Ramp Improvements The City annually schedules sidewalk ramp intersection improvements at various locations for accessibility. Staff and the contractor are reviewing the estimated Statements of Work prior to processing.
- Adrienne Street Pier The contractor anticipates receipt of materials within two weeks. Work
 is scheduled accordingly upon delivery. The pier will remain closed to the public for additional
 work.
- **Boca Grande Drainage Improvements** City and the consultant Engineer discussed the revision of the pending supplemental agreement to complete the design.



- **City Wide Drainage Swale Regrading** Sodding is complete on Almar Dr. and the swale work is complete with JRL Underground. The swale regrading contract is currently out for bid.
- **King Street Survey and Plan** The survey is complete and under City review for a street plan. The surveyor invoice has been reviewed, approved and submitted for payment processing.

Parks and Grounds

• **Ponce De Leon Fishing Pier** – Staff received a call from a citizen that reported a metal object in the waterway channel at Ponce De Leon Park near the fishing pier. Staff recovered the two metal railings that were reported stolen from the fishing pier last month. The railing will be cleaned and welded back into place.





Police

FBI Recognition – Punta Gorda Police Department's Lieutenant Terry Cochran, along with Lieutenant John Heck (CCSO), Sergeant Chris Tice (LCSO/FBI), and Detective Adam Taylor (NPPD), received FBI Director Certificates at a ceremony at the Public Safety Complex regarding their involvement in the joint investigation involving Ian McGuire and Bretton Osborne. This investigation led to both subjects being conviced in federal court for cyber stalking and conspiracy.



McGuire was sentenced to sixty months in federal prison and Osborne was sentenced to forty-four months in federal prison. Both subjects were ordered to pay \$18,000 in restitution. Special thanks to 20th Judicial Circuit Deputy Chief Assistant State Attorney Shannon Doolity and Assistant State Attorney Jill Kuykendall for their assistance.

• **Police Officer Testing** – The police department is currently accepting applications for the position of Police Officer. Testing will be held on Aug. 23 with oral board interviews scheduled on Aug. 24 and Aug. 25. Currently we are only accepting applications from candidates who are currently certified, Equivalency of Training (EOT) eligible, current law enforcement academy students, or those with prior experience in a law enforcement related field.

- Public Safety Dispatcher Testing The Punta Gorda Police Department is currently accepting applications for the position of Public Safety Dispatcher. Testing will be held on Aug. 30.

Fire Department

Water Safety – As the temperature heats up, there is no question that summer is upon us. The City of Punta Gorda is the place to be in the warmer months, as we are surrounded by our beautiful Charlotte Harbor which supplies an endless amount of waterway activities to cool off in the heat. Alarmingly, a 2019 CDC report ranked Florida 6th in the nation in 2019 for unintentional drownings (according to the CDC). This highlights the necessity to take caution while participating in water activities such as swimming, kayaking, boating, etc. Preparation



and safety precautions are key to ensuring that our family and friends can enjoy a summer on the water.Did you know? The majority of our members at the Punta Gorda Fire Department are Rescue Diver certified. In addition to full scuba gear, each apparatus also carries specialized Rapid Diver equipment, which is specifically designed to be quickly deployed in the event of a water emergency. With an average on-scene time of four minutes, our divers are trained and ready to respond 24/7/365 to any waterway emergency. Due to the dangerous nature of water emergencies, it is vital that responders continually train on the Rapid Diver equipment and further our knowledge on the waterways here in the City of Punta Gorda. Each member practiced donning and doffing Rapid Diver gear, and practiced rescue swimming.


Honor Guard Course - Firefighter/Paramedic Rhett Anderson completed a 40-hour Honor Guard course. Rhett was one of thirty students who attended this course. Other departments in attendance were Charlotte County Fire and EMS, Charlotte County Sheriff's Office, Iona-McGregor Fire, Sarasota County Fire and EMS, West Manatee Fire, Cape Coral Fire, and Cedar Hammock Fire. This course focused on tasks performed by honor guard teams such as proper flag folding technique, posting of flags, flag presentation, conducting funerals, casket carrying, and marching. At the end of the course a competition was held between students to see who had the best techniques in casket watching, presenting of the colors, and flag folding. We are proud of Rhett for participating in this course, as he is a current member of our Honor



Guard team here at the Fire Department. His new knowledge will be a valued addition to our team.
