

Weekly Highlights Report Nov. 19, 2021

City Manager

• City Manager Column – Construction projects in the City of Punta Gorda happen as the result of many the efforts of many different departments. From City Council, the Office of the City Manager, Finance, Procurement, Urban Design, Public Works, and Utilities each generally have a role to play in creating positive change in the community. Every day there are projects at various stages that are strategically moved through the process towards completion. I'll highlight a few of the projects that are underway this fall.



If you have paid a visit to the City Hall Annex, you will have noticed the relocation of several departments. The City Hall Annex is undergoing a variety of security and American's

With Disabilities Act accessibility projects. The project has had a slight delay due to the availability of materials but is still on track for 2022 completion.

On West William Street, a much-needed sidewalk is in development. This sidewalk will connect many residential properties with commercial properties in the neighborhood. Surveying, legal property easements, and outside utility relocation have been completed. Funding for the sidewalk comes from the 1% Sales Tax program.

The Boca Grande and Corte Andre area drainage improvement project continues to make progress. A hearing to obtain the last property needed for a retention area is scheduled for January. Public Works has received 90% design plans. Staff continues to work on permits and grant opportunities for funding this 5.7 million dollar project.

Harborwalk West Area 2B is the next phase of the multi-year project at Gilchrist Park. This portion of the project will provide park improvements to Gilchrist Park and streetscape enhancements to W Retta Esplanade. They include on-street parking, parking lot improvements, and site furnishings. These are designed to increase accessibility and functionality within the park and improve roadway safety and parking. The project is currently out for bid solicitation, the bid will be opened on Dec. 3, and it is funded through the 1% Sales Tax program.

Laishley Park playground replacement involves adding additional splash pad features, new playground area, and equipment. The final plans and construction checklist have been received. The bid solicitation is being prepared, and construction should begin in early 2022.

The A. C. Freeman House is a historic home owned by the city, located at 311 West Retta Esplanade. The city contracted with Parker Mudgett Smith Architects to prepare a comprehensive building evaluation of the necessary architectural design, engineering, landscape, and construction documents to complete the structure's

rehabilitation. The required architectural details will restore the historic character of the building. The Comprehensive Building Evaluation is complete. This building evaluation includes recommendations from the architectural project team on how to proceed with the rehabilitation to maximize the potential of the intended home museum, office, and small events space uses. The next step is to design the space and concurrently applying to place the A.C. Freeman House on the National Historic Register.

These are just a few of the projects staff of the City of Punta Gorda currently has in progress. These projects further the city's mission to preserve and enhance Punta Gorda's identity as a vibrant waterfront community, unique in character and history, and as a desirable place to live, work and visit. - FPL/Comcast Update In the last two weeks, FPL has pulled several duplicate poles on Aqui Esta, Magdalena and Coronado in PGI. They will be working on Bal Harbor Blvd. and Tripoli Blvd. after these are complete, as well as several of the individual locations we notified them about over the last couple of months. Specific locations have been provided to them. We have asked them to focus on the main artery roads now so it does not interfere with high season traffic flows. Comcast relocated wires on several poles, including 800, 812, 1650 and 1699 W. Marion Ave., 361 and 198 Shreve St., 198 Berry St., 3663, 3687 and 3681 Tripoli Blvd. and 362 Santander Ct. If you have a more than one pole in your front yard and an old pole that hasn't been taken down, if wires are hanging on the new pole or any other concern about this project, please email Mayor Matthews with your name, address and contact phone and email WITH PHOTOS to support your request, and send to lmatthews@cityofpuntagordafl.com. The City Manager and Mayor Matthews are sharing the emails with both companies so all properties get restored.

Planning

• Permits – The City has seen an increase in new single-family permits along with new homeowners. It is also the time of year in which we welcome back our seasonal residents. City Staff would like to remind our residents that permits are required for many different activities within residential and commercial zoning districts. The following are examples of activities which require a permit through the Code Compliance division: garage sales, parking in the right-of-way, recreational vehicle parking,



watercraft parking, moving vehicles, dumpsters, PODs, business events, business promotions and grand openings. In addition, many outdoor home improvement projects, such as paver patios, sidewalks, landscape walls, etc., may require permits through the Building and/or Zoning and Code Compliance division. Staff invites residents to contact Zoning and Code Compliance while in the planning stage of a project, prior to commencing construction to determine if permits will be required, pgcode@CityofPuntaGordaFL.com or (941)575-3352.

• Staff Appointment — City of Punta Gorda Principal Planner, Mitchell Austin was reelected this week as Chair of the Charlotte County - Punta Gorda Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Technical Advisory Committee (TAC). The TAC is an advisory committee composed of technical staff from Charlotte County, the Airport Authority, the Sheriff's Office, the City of Punta Gorda, and the City of North Port. The TAC serves as an advisory role to the MPO Board on matters related to its role in transportation planning policy and projects which use Federal or State funding. Public Works

Canal Maintenance

- Canal Odor Don't be alarmed if you have noticed an odor floating up from your canals. The water in our canals and ponds is on the move vertically! The surface water, which was warmed by the hot summer sun, has been cooling down as the temperatures drop causing the water to 'flip' or 'turn'. This means that the bottom (including silt, decomposing plant material and miscellaneous debris) comes to the surface bringing with it a smell of stagnant water, while the surface water goes to the bottom. This is a natural occurrence and typically lasts approximately two weeks then returns to normal.
- Seawall Replacement Projects Punta Gorda Isles has 42 seawall replacement projects scheduled for this fiscal year and the seawall replacement contractor has six projects under construction. Burnt Store Isles has seven seawall replacement projects scheduled for this fiscal year and at this time none are under construction. A seawall replacement project can consist of multiple properties. A seawall project is not considered complete until the sod has been placed.

Crews filled depressions at 32 locations.

Crews manufactured 20 (10' linear feet) seawall panels

Crews patched and repaired 65' linear feet of seawall cap/seam.

Crews removed one large piling from the waterway

• Seawall Replacement Schedule - The annual Seawall Replacement Work Program can be found on the City of Punta Gorda website under Canal Maintenance https://www.ci.punta-gorda.fl.us/home/showpublisheddocument/12550/637643718591830000. Every year the City replaces approximately 12,000 linear feet of seawall. By utilizing the Seawall Assessment Data, the seawall replacement program is planned a year in advance (unexpected seawall failures or seawalls that are inspected and found to be at extreme risk of failure are given top priority and may bump planned projects to the following year).

Engineering

- **Henry Street Sidewalk** Final construction plan revisions and drainage calculations are being completed. Coordination will continue with FDOT on work within their drainage easement and the sidewalk connection at US41.
- **Harbor Walk West End Lighting** The installation of five additional decorative lights street between Shreve Street and the tidal bridge at the west end of Retta Esplanade has begun. The underground conduits and light bases have been installed and the electrical wiring is expected to be installed by the end of next week.

- **Boca Grande Drainage Improvements** Bi-weekly design project update meetings continue. The Engineer of record submitted the 90% plans to Southwest Florida Water Management District for review.
- Paving Program Street Resurfacing The contractors work continues with Milling and resurfacing through Dec. 1 weather and operations depending. Milling and resurfacing is complete on: S. Seagrape, N. Seagrape, N. Blue Sage, Clusia Rosea, Scarlet Sage, Scarlet Sage Ct., Rock Dove, White Ibis and Woodthrush. Milling is complete on Knighthawk, Owl, Wren and Raven. 
<u>Fire</u>
