Planning

• City Council Workshop – On Nov. 19, City Council held a Public Workshop to discuss the proposed changes to the City of Punta Gorda, Code of Ordinances, Chapter 26, Land Development Regulation. Urban Design staff provided a presentation focusing specifically on Building Height, Community Benefits Program, Architecture and Implementation. What is the height of the Hospital, Medical Offices, and Condominiums?



Bayfront Health Punta Gorda (809 E Marion Avenue) was built in 1956 thru 1981 in several phases. The approximate building height is 48 feet, and is a three story hospital. The Bayfront Medical Office Building (713 E Marion Avenue) was built in 2006. The building is 65 feet, with three stories of habitable space over one level of parking and is used as a medical office. The Peace Harbor Condominiums (900 E Marion Avenue) were built in 2006. The building is 60 feet to the top of the tower and 50 feet to the top of the roof. It residential with three habitable stories over one level of parking. The Harbor Walk Condominiums (200 Harbor Walk Drive – at Laishely Park) were built in 1999 – 2001 in three phases. The building height is 65 feet. It is residential with four stories of habitable space over one level of parking. The Charlotte County Justice Center (350 E Marion Avenue) was built in 1999. The building is 114 feet to the top of the tower and 76 feet to the top of the courthouse wing. The five story building's use is government - courthouse (Zoned Planned Development – Public).



Was there any type of traffic study completed for the proposed Flex Commercial and Medical Districts?

In 2018 the City of of Punta Gorda completed a Transportation Build Out Study in preperation for the upcoming Citywide Master Plan process. This 2018 study looked at anticipated travel demand to 2045. This study used population and employment projections based on existing conditions and anticipated growth. The travel demand model used to generate the anticiapted traffic conditions is the same one used by the Florida Department of Transportation. The study did not identify any major roadway failures. A roadway failure from a traffic/transportation planning perspective is when anticipated volume, number of vehicles per hour or day, exceeds the roadway capacity, based on roadway condition factors, by a factor of 20 percent or more. Within the roadway network within and immediately adjacent to the City only the US 41 Northbound bridge over Charlotte Harbor exceeds the 120 percent of capacity threshold for a major traffic volume failure. Within the downtown and east of downtown area all roadway segments for 2045 traffic volumes were under 80 percent of roadway capacity. Public Works

Canal Maintenance

- Canal Odor Don't be alarmed if you have noticed an odor floating up from your canals. The water in our canals and ponds is on the move vertically! The surface water, which was warmed by the hot summer sun, has been cooling down as the temperatures drop causing the water to 'flip' or 'turn'. This means that the bottom (including silt, decomposing plant material and miscellaneous debris) comes to the surface bringing with it a smell of stagnant water, while the surface water goes to the bottom. This is a natural occurrence and typically lasts approximately two weeks then returns to normal.
- Seawall Assessment Beginning Dec. 2, City staff will be performing the Annual Seawall Assessment during low tide periods until Mar. 2022. City staff will be inspecting seawalls in the southerly half of Punta Gorda Isles and all of Burnt Store Isles (blue zone) from the waterside while traversing canals in a boat. Residents may see city staff in a boat close to their seawalls while inspecting the condition of seawalls.



• Seawall Replacement Projects - Punta Gorda Isles has 42 seawall replacement projects scheduled for this fiscal year and the seawall replacement contractor has six projects under construction. Burnt Store Isles has seven seawall replacement projects scheduled for this fiscal year and at this time none are under construction. A seawall replacement project can consist of multiple properties. A seawall project is not considered complete until the sod has been placed.

Crews filled depressions at 17 locations.

• Seawall Replacement Schedule - The annual Seawall Replacement Work Program can be found on the City of Punta Gorda website under Canal Maintenance https://www.ci.punta-gorda.fl.us/home/showpublisheddocument/12550/637643718591830000. Every year the City replaces approximately 12,000 linear feet of seawall. By utilizing the Seawall Assessment Data, the seawall replacement program is planned a year in advance (unexpected seawall failures or seawalls that are inspected and found to be at extreme risk of failure are given top priority and may bump planned projects to the following year).

Engineering

- **Boca Grande Drainage Improvements** Bi-weekly design is approaching 90 percent review. The Engineer of record has submitted 90% plans to the Southwest Florida Water Management District for review. A Water Quality grant submittal meeting was conducted this week with the South Florida Water management district staff reviewer.
- **Henry Street Sidewalk** Final construction plan revisions and drainage calculations are being completed. Coordination will continue with FDOT on work within their drainage easement and the sidewalk connection at US41.
- Paving Program Street Resurfacing The contractors work continues with Milling and resurfacing. Milling of existing asphalt is occurring on Almar Drive and Muscovie Court. Paving is complete on: Owl Court, Wren Court, Raven Court, Coldeway Dive and Lewis Circle. Paving is scheduled on Almar Drive, Muscovie Court within the next week. Harborside Avenue is scheduled for milling and resurfacing within the next week or two. • Harbor Walk West End Lighting – The installation of five additional decorative lights street between Shreve Street and the tidal bridge at the west end of Retta Esplanade continues. The underground conduits and light bases have been installed. Due to weather and the holiday workweek, the electrical wiring installation has been delayed and should be complete by week of Dec. 6.



Wastewater Treatment

- Maintenance Team members continue the process of tightening the thousands of nuts and bolts that secure the 20 sections together on the new Filter Press building. The contracted vendor continues to remove the old interior coating from the North tank at the Master Pumping Facility. Team members were able to haul and inject 196000 gallons of bio-solids to field two this week.
- **Operations** The average daily flow for the past week was 2.63 million gallons for a total of 18.41 million gallons of wastewater being treated this week.
