# **City Manager**

City Manager Column – Last week our friend, Fire Chief Ray Briggs, retired. Chief Briggs faithfully protected the residents and visitors of Punta Gorda for over 30 years. He started his career as a Volunteer firefighter, then progressed through the ranks as a career Firefighter, Lieutenant, Training Chief, Operations Chief, and has held the position of Fire Chief/Emergency Manager for the last eight years. The advice and leadership Chief Briggs provided throughout the public health emergency that COVID created and the many potential hurricanes and actual hurricanes that hit Punta Gorda are greatly appreciated. Special thank you to Ray's wife, Debbie, and his children for the sacrifices they have made throughout his career.



As a lifelong Charlotte County resident Chief Briggs added value far beyond the firehouse, creating new programs to benefit the community and serving others. Chief Briggs introduced a bike medic program to the community in 2014. This program allows emergency personnel to reach people quickly during festivals and mass gatherings, rather than waiting for an ambulance or fire truck to navigate through the crowd. Ray's leadership was felt by those outside the United States as well. Mission trips to Guatemala that Chief Briggs helped organize and participate in brought basic medical care and supplies, installed cooking stoves, and made a difference in the lives of families. His leadership of the Punta Gorda Fire Department is appreciated and has set the department up to continue excellence into the future. All appreciate his volunteerism and community engagement. We wish Chief Briggs all the best in the next chapter of his life.

Holden Gibbs has been named the new interim Fire Chief. Holden has most recently served as the Fire Operations Chief and has been a Punta Gorda Fire Department team member for more than 21 years. Interim Chief Gibbs has been instrumental in drafting the Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response Grant (SAFER) application to fund additional fire personnel and has played a vital role in union negotiations.

Holden has recently worked closely with Charlotte County Emergency Management and City of Punta Gorda IT staff to update the Punta Gorda Fire Department's Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP). The COOP is an action plan to ensure that essential functions will be met when activated in response to a wide range of events or situations – from a fire in the building; to a natural disaster; to the threat or occurrence of a terrorist attack. We appreciate Interim Chief Gibbs willingness to take on the additional responsibilities and his commitment to the department.

Careers in emergency services are by no means easy or glamorous. It takes an individual with courage, intelligence, and compassion to be the best of the best in these professions. We are fortunate in the City of Punta Gorda to have leaders with those characteristics that are committed to serving our residents and visitors. # **Public Works**

### **Canal Maintenance**

Bass and Snook Inlet Dredge -Beginning June 6, through June (weather and equipment operation permitting), the Bass and Snook Inlet are scheduled to be dredged. The contractor will offload dredge material at the easterly end of Elizabeth Park and then the material will transported to another location by dump trucks. Boaters are asked to please use caution in this area during construction.



• Ponce De Leon Inlet - Beginning
the week of June 13, through June 30, (weather and equipment operation permitting), the Ponce
Inlet is scheduled to be dredged. The contractor will offload dredge material at the vacant lot at
the southerly end of Colony Point; then the material will be transported to another location by
dump trucks.



- Seawall Replacement Punta Gorda Isles has 44 seawall replacement projects scheduled for the fiscal year 2021/2022, and the seawall replacement contractor has 12 projects under construction and has completed 16 projects. Burnt Store Isles has eight seawall replacement projects scheduled for the fiscal year 2021/2022. The seawall replacement contractor has six projects under construction and has completed two projects. A seawall replacement project can consist of multiple properties. A seawall project is not considered complete until the sod has been placed.
  - > Crews filled depressions at eight locations
  - > Crews patched/repaired (79' linear feet) seawall caps/seams
  - > Crews manufactured (18) seawall panels

Every year the City replaces approximately 12,000 linear feet of seawall. By utilizing the Seawall Assessment Data, the seawall replacement program is planned a year in advance (unexpected seawall failures or seawalls that are inspected and found to be at extreme risk of failure are given top priority may bump planned projects to the following year).

# **Engineering**

- **Boca Grande Drainage Improvement project** The Engineer of record continues with the 90% design revisions to address utility conflicts and preparation of the Southwest Florida Water Management District permit submittal. The next bi-weekly meeting is scheduled for June 17.
- Harborwalk Parking and Upland Improvements Harborwalk two parking and uplands improvement project underground drainage and catch basin installation is occurring. The pickleball court parking area has been closed in preparation for demolition. Tree removals have commenced in this area. Gilchrist St. near W. Retta Esplanade is closed to accommodate drainage pipe and stormwater inlet modifications.
- City Wide Drainage Swale Regrading Swale work on Swale work on Bal Harbor, Sandpiper, and Whip-poor-will Blvd between Eider and Partridge is still being watered by the contractor. The contractor has begun re-grading the swales on Jacana Ct. Work will begin on Sea Gull



Ct./Turtle Dove Blvd., by the contractor on June 6. Pipe elevations have been calculated on McGregor, Ann, and Lemon St. Grade stakes will be installed this week for the contractor to regrade the ROW. The re-grading for these locations will begin on June 20.


• **Storm Preparation** – The fire department would like to share some tips to prepare your yards before a storm hits. These tips can save you clean up time after a storm and possible a broken window or two.

# **Storm preparation for your yard:**

- Remove all yard debris such as fallen branches and lawn decorations
- ➤ Remove unsecured items such as hanging potted plants, decorative pillows, BBQ grills and patio furniture
- Make sure your gutters and storm drains are clear to allow water to drain
- ➤ Inspect trees for rotting branches that may break off during a storm
- ➤ Have trees trimmed before a storm hits

- **Maintenance** Team members continue to mow and trim the plant and remote station grounds. Staff was able to haul and inject 140000 gallons of Bio-solids to field four this week.
- **Operations** The average daily flow for the past week was 2.84 million gallons for a total of 19.87 million gallons of wastewater being treated this week.

• Candidate Packets Now Available – Candidate packets for the 2022 City General Election are now available through the City Clerk's Office, City Hall, 117 Herald Court Centre, Unit 112. The 2022 General Election will take place on Nov. 8 and will include City Council Districts 1, 2, and 4. Councilmembers serve a two (2) year term and are elected at-large. Only opposed candidate races will appear on the ballot. If more than two candidates seek election for any one district seat, a primary election must be held on Aug. 23 (11 weeks prior to the General Election). Qualifying for the 2022 General Election cycle begins Jun. 13 at noon and ends on Jun. 17 at noon. - Code Enforcement Board (two alternate) Meets monthly on the fourth Wednesday at 9 a.m. in City Council Chambers. City residency required. Seven-member board with two alternate members. Three-year terms, maximum of three terms OR partial term plus two more terms. Financial disclosure required.
- **Utility Advisory Board** (three regular) Meets monthly on the fourth Monday at 9 a.m. in City Council Chambers. City residency required. Seven-member board. Three-year terms, maximum of two terms. Makes recommendations to City Council with regard to, but not limited to, revisions to the utility construction standards, alleged billing discrepancies, and review of utility drawings and specifications.
- **Planning Commission** (two regular) Meets the 4th Monday at 2:00 p.m. in City Council Chambers. Must be City resident. Seven member board with two alternate members. Three year terms maximum of three terms. Makes recommendations to City Council with regard to amending, extending or adding to the comprehensive plan for the physical development of the City, platting or subdividing land within the City and adopting and amending a zoning ordinance.
