International Caps Lock Day:

All joking aside, writing in "all caps" is often interpreted as shouting, and is therefore discouraged. Studies have also shown that words written in uppercase text are harder to read and are read 10 percent slower than other text.

Some experts say that uppercase text affects word shape recognition.

If attention is what you're after, the consensus is to use bold text. Since most people scan text instead of reading word for word, content such as headlines, sub-heads, bullet lists and bold text draws their attention.

A Little History

The History of capital (or upper) and lowercase letters goes all the way back to the 3rd century when all the letters in the Latin and Greek were in uncial (or large) letters. The minuscule (or small) letters were introduced over time around the 9th century as paper moved away from the rough papyrus more toward the smooth parchment of the day. The lowercase letters were more rounded, showed more distinction and flowed more easily from one to the other. Soon the uncial letters were used more for emphasis than anything else.
