FREE DISASTER CLEANUP ASSISTANCE

CURFEW

There is a daily curfew in place from 10 p.m. – 6 a.m.

BOIL WATER

Due to substantial storm impacts, boil all drinking water until further notice. Bring water to a rolling boil for one minute. This includes tap water and well water, all water used for drinking, cooking, making ice, brushing teeth or washing dishes.

GENERATOR SAFETY

Portable generators are often used after disasters in areas without power. Follow these tips for safe generator use to avoid carbon monoxide (CO) exposure.

Take these precautions to help prevent carbon monoxide poisoning:

- Do not burn charcoal or gas grills inside a house, garage, vehicle, tent, or fireplace.
- Never use a generator indoors, including in homes, garages, basements, crawl spaces and other enclosed or partially enclosed areas, even with ventilation. Opening doors and windows or using fans will not prevent CO build-up in the home.
- Never use a tarp, plastic or other covering over a generator. This inhibits the air flow and is a potential fire hazard.
- Always locate the unit outdoors on a dry surface, away from doors, windows, vents, and air conditioning equipment that could allow CO to come indoors.

FOOD SAFETY

In the case of an electrical outage, it is important to take careful precautions to ensure food safety. Discard any perishable food that has been at room temperature for two hours or more and any food that has an unusual odor, color, or texture. Not all spoiled food will have an unusual odor, color, or texture, so remember, when in doubt, throw it out!

POWER LINES

Downed power lines are dangerous. **Never touch them.** For safety's sake, always assume that a fallen power line is live, and follow these guidelines: Avoid touching the downed line with your hand or an object, such as a stick, broom or pole.

GARBAGE PICKUP

Curbside collection service will resume Wednesday, Oct. 5. The collection will follow regular schedule (Wednesday customers on Wednesday, etc) and will only be picking up regular household solid waste. No recycling, vegetation, or construction and demolition will be collected until further notice.
