



MONTHLY REPORT SEPTEMBER 2015

COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY

LAISHLEY PARK MUNICIPAL MARINA

- Of the 94 permitted slips and 42 moorings, there are:
 - 46 annual contracts
 - 9 semi-annual contracts
 - 6 monthly contracts
 - 14 commercial contracts
 - 0 transients
 - 8 moorings

(13 free public side tie, 1 pump out dock, 4 slips for PGPD, CCSO & FWC, and marina work boat)

- Including moorings, 17 renters are staying on their boats in the marina.
- Community Room had 18 bookings for August and currently has 14 reservations for September.

PUMPOUT VESSEL

- SS Clearhead activity as of August 26, 2015:
 - 34 pump-outs (all Florida registered vessels)
 - 1,150 gallons
 - Boat traveled approximately 104 miles

LAISHLEY PARK IMPROVEMENTS

- Repair inside of Marina Building Tarpon Bay
 Construction has been hired to detect and repair
 leaks. Testing completed 8/26/15; leak is due to
 improperly installed window flashing. Contractor
 putting together an estimate for the repair.
- Installation of Perimeter
 Railing Contractor
 began installation of
 handrail on 8/25/15.




HARBORWALK PROJECTS

- **US 41 South Bridge Underpass** 60% construction plans continue to be under review.
- Laishley Park Municipal Marina The completed plan set, legal description, sketch and permit application were delivered to the FDOT for permitting.
- Harborwalk West Area 1 100% design plans have been submitted to FDOT.

HARBORWALK PROJECTS

Harborwalk West Seawall – work continues;
 330 linear feet of seawall panels have been

installed.



FITNESS ZONE PHASE II

 Equipment delivery expected in mid-September; construction tentatively scheduled to begin 9/21/15 with anticipated completion by mid-October.
