

Historic City Hall Project

Project Purpose

Create an accessible, functional, secure, and welcoming civic building that rehabilitates and protects the 1926 City Hall structure for continued use, and provides space for council members and citizens to meet in both a fit-for-purpose council chamber and in smaller group settings.

New Council Chambers

Council Member Dias: 7 seats
City Officers: 4 seats
Attendees: 100 seats

Historic Information

Built in 1926 in a Neo-Classical Revival architectural style the City Hall building is listed as a contributing structure to the Punta Gorda National Register District. The building also served as a fire station upon completion with the fire truck garage facing Harvey Street. In 1978 the existing council chambers was added (before ADA regulations) and the fire garage was enclosed as the office of the City Clerk.


