20th Century – Scout House to Bayfront Center

- Built in 1956
 - Scout House
 - Youth activities and groups
- Building additions
 - 1960's 1970's
 - Continued community uses
- Building Size
 - ~9,500 sq. ft.
 - Several floor levels



21st Century – Bayfront Center Uses

- Hurricane Charley 2004
 - Roof replacement
 - Storm shutters added
- City offices 2005 2012
 - Public Works
 - Utilities
- YMCA lease 2013 2022
 - Programs
 - Sub-leases
 - Event uses

Planning for the Future – 2004: Concept for Replacement

- Purpose built community center
 - 8,100 sq.ft
 - 2 20' X 50' pavilions
 - 2 20' X 40' pavilions
- Reconfigured parking
- More green space




Image: 2004 conceptual building elevation by City staff




Image: 2004 conceptual site plan by City staff

Planning for the Future – 2018 Gilchrist Park Activity Center

- Project and report by TEAM Punta Gorda on behalf of the City
 - Project Objective:

"...provide unbiased information regarding the desires of community members as it relates to the activities potentially offered on the site in the event a project moves forward..." to replace the existing buildings

- Stake holder interviews
- Community input survey
- 42 page report
- Presentation to City Council



Planning for the Future – 2019 Waterfront Development Plan

- Plan by Punta Gorda Boaters
 Alliance
- Boat Club/Bayfront recommendations
 - 1. Renovate both existing buildings
 - 2. Remove old buildings and replace with a new structure
 - 3. Do nothing (not an acceptable solution)

Waterfront Master Plan Mission Statement

This Plan will seek to establish Punta Gorda as THE premier recreational boating community in the continental United States.  - Building alternatives




Image: 2019 Option 2a modest new building by Dover Kohl and Partners for City of Punta Gorda

Gilchrist Waterfront Activity Center – Option 2a: Modest New Building

- 1st floor (at BFE)
 - 7,600 sq.ft. indoor
 - 4,400 sq. ft. event hall
 - 1,500 sq. ft classroom
 - 1,600 sq. ft covered terrace
 - 4,000 sq. ft. courtyard
- Mezzanine (partial 2nd floor)
 - 1,500 sq. ft. overlooking event hall





Gilchrist Waterfront Activity Center – Option 2b: Grand Building

- 1st floor (at grade)
 - 10,000 sq.ft. open air
 - 4,200 sq.ft. storage
- 2nd floor (above BFE)
 - 9,200 sq.ft. indoor
 - 7,200 sq.ft. event hall
 - 2,000 sq. ft. classrooms
 - 2,500 sq.ft. veranda


