

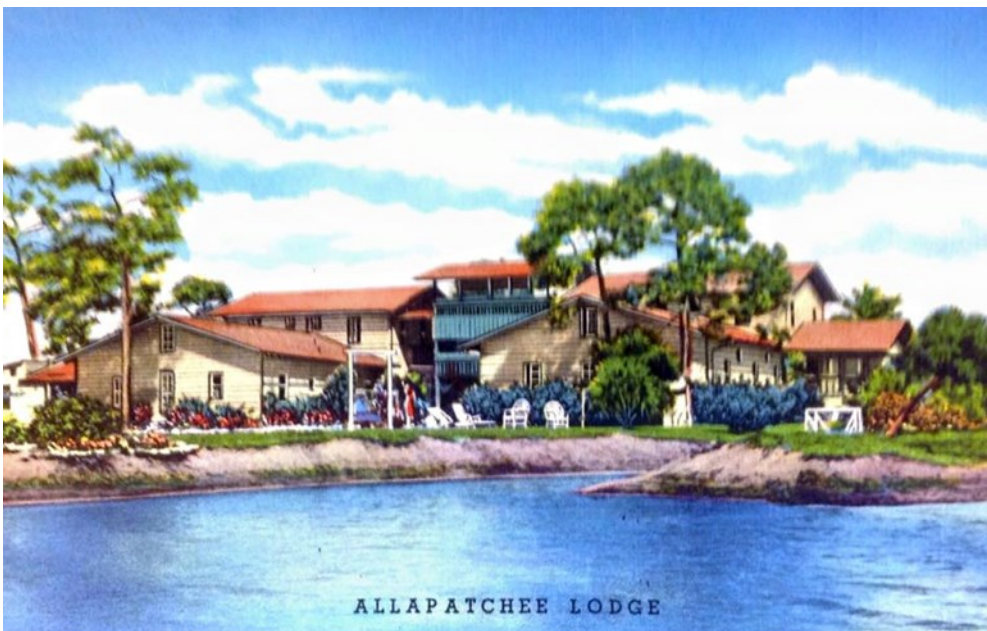
Interesting facts about Louis Calder, his legacy nationwide and his connections to Florida and Punta Gorda.

The **Louis Calder Center is Fordham University's** biological field station. The Calder Center is a protected forest preserve located 30 miles north of New York City in Armonk, New York, and is the only full-time ecological research field station in the New York metropolitan area.

Allapatchee Lodge once stood on Alligator Creek right where Burnt Store Villas and Twin Isles Golf Course's is today. Built by Lou Calder, a wealthy New York businessman, in the 1920s, the once luxurious lodge was torn down in the 1970s to clear the land for the golf course. Allapatchee is the Seminole word for alligator.
