"The Rec", as it is known to community members has been the center of civic life, community, and personal development over the decades. Cooper Street Recreation Center strategic partnerships allow "The Rec" to provide intergenerational programming for the community.

Community News

Blanchard House Museum Library

For over 10 years, Cooper Street Recreation Center and the Blanchard House Museum have partnered to create the Blanchard House Museum Research Library. The books used to research each year's new museum exhibits are donated to the Library at the close of the season. The Blanchard House Museum Research Library now also serves as a Creative Writing Center overseen by former principal, Ms. Eunice Wiley. The Creative Writing Center was created to cultivate the creative writing skills of youth, allowing them to confidently communicate their thoughts and feeling through the written word.

Ms. Wiley will be providing writing classes to teens to have them develop their creative writing skills and write their college application essays. We also have a retired librarian who will be helping us re-catalog all the books in the research library.

YMCA Before & After-school Program

Port Charlotte Library has partnered with Cooper Street Recreation Center to provide enrichment classes to children in the Afterschool Program. Port Charlotte Library's Youth Librarian comes in once-a-month to provide art enrichment classes to children during the afternoon program with the YMCA.

Education & Career Resource Center

The Education & Career Resource Library will be re-opening next month. We have been updating information on colleges and universities, art schools, culinary schools, and trade schools for the 2023 - 2024 entrance cycle; as well as financial aid application information in both English and Spanish; college entrance exams preparation materials; professional exam preparation materials, such as for the nursing, CMA, CDL, pharmacy tech, and finance/insurance career exams. The updated career and educational outreach materials are being organized at this time. We have plans to work with the Port Charlotte Library to provide college prep and financial aid workshops for teens and their families in the future. We also have a group of volunteers to provide career guidance and mentoring for teens.

To expand the resource and training offerings provided by Cooper Street Recreation Center's Education & Career Outreach Center, Cooper Street Recreation Center has partnered with the **Small Business Development Center (SBDC) at Florida Gulf Coast University** to promote entrepreneurship among our residents and to assist area small business clients to assist them with development, planning, growth, marketing, capital-access needs, and more. Pre-COVID it was recognized that in offering our youth (and their families) information on education and career options, that we were lacking resources for those who were more geared to entrepreneurship. The partnership with the SBDC allows us to be a full-service Education & Career resource center for the community. There are two staff members on-hand to provide business counseling and training to assist small businesses and entrepreneurs in the community.

Small business is the foundation of our economy. It allows people to utilize their strengths and turn them into financial security for their families. According to the United Way's 2020 ALICE study, in Charlotte County **30%** of households (approximately 29,964 households) fall into the category of ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed), while another **10%** of Charlotte County households live at Federal Poverty Level, meaning that close to half (**40%**) are struggling to meet basic needs. Living paycheck to paycheck, the only way that they will be able to achieve financial security is with having more income. For these working families, owning a small business in the side can provide them with more financial freedom. SBDC at Cooper Street

Recreation Center is here to assist our community in creating more financial freedom and intergeneration wealth. SBCD's services **are free of charge** to all residents.

Additionally, this also serves as valuable resource for our retirees. AARP has found that entrepreneurs 55 years and older have a 70%+ success rate in entrepreneurship. The income from a small business can provide financial security for our retirees well into the future.
