

WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS REPORT May 3, 2024

City Manager

• The City of Punta Gorda has been known as the Hibiscus City since 1926. In that year, Harry R. Goulding provided hibiscus plantings throughout the city. Harry Goulding made Punta Gorda his home and was known by many for his world-class, award-winning hybrid hibiscus plants, growing some 60,000 varieties of hibiscus over 60 years. He won many accolades and awards, including the prestigious American Hibiscus Society show's "Best in the World" category five times.

To continue efforts to highlight the City's designation as the Hibiscus City, the 20th Annual Hibiscus Festival will be held in Gilchrist Park from May 3, through May 5, and includes a Friday evening concert, unveiling the King and Queen of Hibiscus on Saturday, plant sales and continuous music on Saturday and Sunday, as well as food vendors and other activities.



The City Council of Punta Gorda has proclaimed May 4, as Hibiscus Day. They encourage all residents to plant hibiscus to beautify the city and continue the tradition that began many years ago. During the Hibiscus Festival, Gilchrist Park will be filled with plants that are being sold from some of the finest nurseries around. Vendors are happy to answer questions about how to make newly purchased hibiscus plants thrive.

The event will also feature a craft show filled with jewelry, yard art, pottery, produce, and much more. Unique food vendors will also be onsite, featuring a variety of menu options. The music featured at the Hibiscus Festival is a draw all on its own. There is music on all three days of the festival. - Planning Corner On Apr. 24, City staff attended the ribbon cutting ceremony for the "Harbor Bridges" mural at Laishley Marina's boat ramp. The Punta Gorda Historic Mural Society commissioned and

Public Works

- Canal Maintenance Production Crews filled depressions at 8 locations and fabricated 76 seawall panels due to Hurricane Ian.
- **Dockside Dredging** Property owners that are listed on the Hurricane Ian Seawall Damage list will not be allowed to have dockside dredging performed adjacent to the seawall until the seawall has been repaired. Any dredging along the damaged seawall may cause damage.
- **Stabilizing Erosion** Just a friendly reminder for property owners to regularly check the condition of their tarps or plastic that is protecting the eroded areas. Tarps and plastic tend to become brittle in the sun and may start falling apart. Utilizing plastic during a rain event will help keep the soil in place preventing further erosion.
- Canal Maintenance Seawall Failure Update Construction schedules have been updated and are posted on the Canal Maintenance website for the next six months look ahead. There are 44 projects in Punta Gorda Isles under construction with 148 projects completed, and 17 projects under construction with 30 completed in Burnt Store Isles. - **Establishing sod after seawall replacement** Placing the sod is the final phase of seawall replacement construction. As per the City ordinance, property owners are responsible for establishing the sod after it has been placed and the City will not reimburse the owners for their water usage.
- Vessel Speeds Canal Maintenance is asking people to be mindful of the current situation in the canals with seawalls being damaged. City code states that the operation of vessels in the canals shall be Slow Speed Minimum Wake in the waterways within the City limits. The speed and operation in the Ponce Inlet, Pompano Inlet, Bass, and Snook Inlet are Idle Speed and No Wake. Wakes from watercraft can cause additional erosion and damage to seawalls already compromised.
- **Dock Match Program** The Punta Gorda and Charlotte Harbor Boaters Alliance has created a program that connects boat owners who need a temporary relocation of their boats with owners that have available dock space. Engineering

• **Swale Regrading** – The swale contractor has completed Don Quixote Dr., Brazilia Ct., Darin Dr., Padre Island Dr., Casey Key Dr. (SW), and Ussepa Ct. which have been finalized and turned over to the homeowner. The contractor will be watering the sod for the next 30 days weather permitting at Casey Key Dr. (SE) Turtle Dove Cir. and Sea Horse Ct. They have excavated approximately 63,000 SF this fiscal year. The contractor has begun excavating at Sea Fan Dr and will be excavating approximately 3,800 SF. Once the contractor gets the new grades established they will be installing new sod at the proper elevation. The next street to be excavated will be Grebe Dr.

Construction continues at the Interactive Fountain area in Laishley Park. This work includes rehabilitation and upgrades to the splash pad/play area. Seating and enclosure walls were built this week. Please use extra caution while driving or walking through the park due to construction personnel and equipment. To the highest extent possible the restroom facilities will remain open to the public. The access

to the restrooms will be from the marina side of the building. There will be periodic temporary sidewalk closures immediately adjacent

to the construction area as required for public safety.








The construction area will be closed to the public at all times during this period. The enhanced fountain area is scheduled to reopen in late 2024. If you have any questions, please contact the Public Works Department at (941) 575-5050 during the hours of 8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m., Monday thru Friday.

Fiber Optic Internet Network – The fiber optic internet provider HyperFiber has been issued permits for a portion of the construction project to install a citywide fiber optic internet network within the city right of way. This project will be under construction during the next several months as they install the network citywide. They are currently working in the areas highlighted in red below. The green areas are where the work is completed and their permit has been inspected for final by the engineering department. Additional areas are scheduled to be final in the next several weeks. The blue areas are where the installation will be taking place as the project progresses.



Initially, you will see utility markings within the city right of way, followed by the directional drilling of

the fiber optic conduit. Fiber optic boxes will be installed in the right of way or easement at the edge of your property. Once the installation of the underground and service points has been completed for the entire sector, crews will then return to individual locations for the restoration of sod. This will take place at the end of construction in each sector. Please be patient and allow time for the restoration. The city engineering department will be performing spot inspections during construction as well as a final inspection when restoration is complete to ensure the contractor's restoration meets the city's requirements.

HyperFiber has provided a telephone number to call if citizens have questions or concerns about

the project and installation. Please contact HyperFiber's Scott Jackson at (239) 887-5379. Please use extra caution while driving through the project area due to construction personnel and equipment.

- ➤ Cul-de-Sacs Residents are not allowed to place yard debris that is generated from their property, vacant lots, or greenbelts on the cul-de-sac for collection. If a resident trimmed the cul-de-sac and vegetation remains, please contact Public Works for collection.
- ➤ Loose Yard Waste Pile Palm fronds, limbs, etc. shall not exceed 4" in diameter or 4' in length. These items must be tied and bundled for collection; bundles shall weigh no more than 35 pounds.

Shrubbery, grass clippings, and leaves must be placed at the curb in containers. Containers shall not exceed 32 gallons in size or 35 pounds in weight and must have handles. Biodegradable paper bags designated for yard waste collection are allowed.

- > Single Family Residents Are allowed no more than three (3) yard waste cans or bags per week. The city does not provide cans for yard waste and residents can purchase a cart from any local hardware store. Please be sure the cart has a lid, wheels, and metal bar across the front.
- ➤ Tree Removal Tree removal and lot clearing is NOT a part of your regular service. If you have a whole tree removed you must first contact Urban Design to obtain a permit (941)575-3372 or FL (punta-gorda.fl.us). The homeowner or company that removes the tree is responsible for hauling away the remains. The City does NOT collect whole tree remains or lot clearing remains.
- ➤ Unacceptable Material Lot clearing debris, tree removal, wood, dirt or rocks, cement edging, mulch, sod, fruit, straw, and hay will not be collected by yard waste crews.
- ➤ Vacant Lots Vacant lots are not eligible for trash or yard waste services. Please do not place any trash or yard waste on vacant lots. The debris will not be collected.
- ➤ Loose Yard Waste Collection Delays Due to the enormous number of requests and limited staff, loose yard waste collection with the clamshell truck might be delayed. If you have a landscaper that maintains the property, please ask them to haul away the debris. Most reputable companies haul away the debris themselves. Thank you for your continued cooperation.




is accepting applications from certified and non-certified candidates.



A primary election will take place on Aug. 20, if we have three or more candidates for one district. The two candidates receiving the most votes would proceed on to the general election.

Makes recommendations to the City Council for the acceptance or rejection of non-monetary gift donations.
- ➤ Historic Preservation Advisory Board (two regular and two alternate) Meets the fourth Thurs. at 9 a.m. in City Council Chambers. Seven-member board with two alternate members. Three-year terms maximum of three terms OR partial term plus two more terms. Identifies for the Council historically significant structures and sites that should be considered for designation as a "Local Historic Landmark" or be nominated for listing on the Florida Master Site File and the National Register of Historic Places. Makes recommendations of the policies for the protection of historically significant structures and sites. Makes recommendations to staff with regard to certificates of appropriateness for any demolition, variance, sign, or relocation of structures.
