Inspect Utilities: Ensure that gas, water, and electrical systems are intact. If you notice any issues, do not attempt repairs yourself—contact a licensed professional.

Document Everything: Take photos of any damage for insurance claims. Keep detailed records of your assessments and any repairs needed.

Check for Mold: Mold can develop quickly in damp conditions. Seek professional remediation if you notice signs, such as a musty odor or visible growth.

Secure Your Property: Ensure that all doors and windows are properly secured.

Stay Informed: Follow local updates regarding cleanup efforts and resources available for residents impacted by the flooding.
