
Important Information About Your Sy New Recycling Cart





Place recyclables curbside by 6 a.m. on your scheduled pickup day. Leave 5' of clearance around your recycling cart and other curbside services.

Waste Management is proud to once again work with the City of Punta Gorda to provide the most comprehensive recycling services. With this program, we are rolling out new recycling carts that offer more privacy and litter control, while allowing you to safely recycle more.

The City of Punta Gorda will continue to provide residents with waste, yard waste, and white goods collection services.

Waste Management will start servicing carts on your next collection date after October 1st

- Do not bag your recyclables.
- Place carts curbside with the opening towards the street, leaving 5 feet of clearance from your mailbox and other curbside services.
- If you know that your neighbor is away when the cart is delivered, please roll their cart up to a safe location.

Think Green with your old recycling bins!

- The current recycling provider will be collecting their blue recycling bins.
- If you have additional recycle bins at your house, Think Green and reuse them to store garden supplies, fishing or boating equipment, or construction materials.
- Once the recycling cart program begins, your current 18-gallon bin will no longer be serviced.

Let's see the benefits!

- Recycling carts with lids offer more privacy and better litter control.
- You can recycle more single-stream materials, which will reduce waste in our landfill and protect our natural resources.
- It is easier and safer for you to roll your cart down your driveway rather than carrying a heavy bin full of bottles and cans.

Waste Management

SINGLE-STREAM RECYCLING CART:

Your new recycling cart is designed to help you recycle more of what you are already recycling:

- Clean Paper, Cardboard, Junk Mail, Newspapers, Phone Books & Magazines
- Aluminum, Tin & Steel Cans
- Plastic Bottles & Containers marked with #1-7 (caps removed)
- Glass Bottles & Jars (caps and lids removed)
- Dairy & Juice Cartons (rinse containers)

DO NOT INCLUDE:

- Plastic Bags
- All Batteries
- Aerosol Cans
- Paint Cans
- Yard Clippings
- **Electronic Waste**
- Garden Hoses
- Food Contaminated or
- Propane/Pressurized Tanks Bagged Recyclables Hypodermic Needles/Syringes
- Polystyrene (Foam Products)
- No Household Hazardous Waste





SPECIAL RECYCLING:

DO NOT place these materials in your recycling containers. Please place them curbside - 5 feet away from your recycling carts.

Electronic Device Recycling Services: Residents will be allowed to place discarded electronics curbside for collection and proper disposal. These include, but are not limited to: computers, monitors, printers, TVs, VCRs, DVD players. They will be collected on the same day as recycling collection, but through a separate noncompaction truck from recycling. An exception tag will be utilized to notify the resident, if item cannot be picked up on the same day.

Tires: Passenger car and street size pickup truck tires (up to 25 inches in diameter) may be collected on your recycling day. You are allowed up to six (6) tires per year. Place the tires, with or without rims, at the curb on the recycling day. You do not have to schedule for this service.

Waste Oil: Residents can place waste oil at the curb, as long as it is stored in a fully enclosed container. Use a self-contained receptacle with a screw on lid for your used motor oil. Waste Management's trucks will be equipped with a special compartment to transport waste oil containers. The orange color stickers are no longer necessary.


Batteries: Non-leaking vehicle lead-acid batteries.

Recycling Services:

RECYCLING COLLECTION MAP:

Waste Management will be delivering residential recycling carts during the week of September 14th through September 19th. Waste Management will begin collecting recycling on your next service day after October 1st. Please use your bins until they are collected by September 30th.

City of Punta Gorda residents will receive service once per week based on the following zones. Residents living in the orange zone will have recycling collected on Tuesdays, in the green zones will have recycling collected on Wednesdays, and in the yellow zone on Friday.

Syringes & Hypodermic Needles

There are three locations for Charlotte County residents to pick up and drop off sharps containers.

How to use your Sharps Container:

- Do not clip the needle.
- Do not recap the needle.
- · Place hypodermic needle in the red sharps container.
- When filled, secure the lid. Do not overfill.
- Take the full sharps container to one of the facilities listed below and you will be given a free replacement container.

Household Hazardous Waste

How do You Know if a Product is Hazardous?

A product is considered hazardous if it is corrosive, toxic, flammable, or reacts or explodes when mixed with other substances. Watch out for signal words on labels such as poison, danger, warning, and caution.

How do You Dispose of Household Hazardous Waste?

Punta Gorda residents may place certain Household Hazardous Waste items curbside for collection. See "Special Recycling" section inside this brochure. Additionally, residents may dispose of items yearround at one of the following Recycling Centers:
