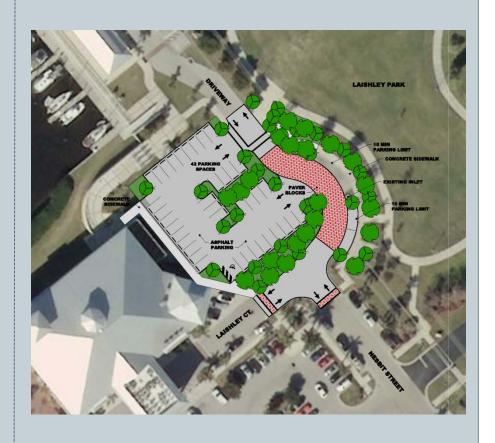

Harborwalk – US 41 SB Bridge Underpass Improvements

- Widen pathway and improve appearance under bridge
- Currently under construction
- Completion anticipated February 2017
- Sales Tax Funds

Harborwalk West – Area 1

- Construction of new Harborwalk and seawall, stormwater, landscape & furnishings.
- Construction to begin December 2016/January 2017

 - Construction \$2,184,695





Harborwalk West – Playground

- Design & build of a new playground at Gilchrist Park
- Construction to begin 2017
- 1% Sales Tax & Private Funds
 - Project budget \$500,000



ADA Transition Plan & Improvements

- Evaluation of services, programs, communications, policies and procedures, including facilities/sites with respect to the American with Disabilities Act of 1990. Development of a plan which will outline adjustments/modifications needed to be ADA compliant. Required Federal and State Grant eligibility.
- Transition Plan to be completed in December 2016 and Improvements, as detailed in the Plan, to begin in January 2017
- General & Sales Tax Funds
 - Project Budget \$217,807

Harborwalk East – Mary Street Connection

- Continuation of the Punta Gorda Pathways; this "leg" of the project will be a connection from Marion Ave. to Harborwalk East
- Improvements to begin in 2017.

 - Project Budget \$45,000



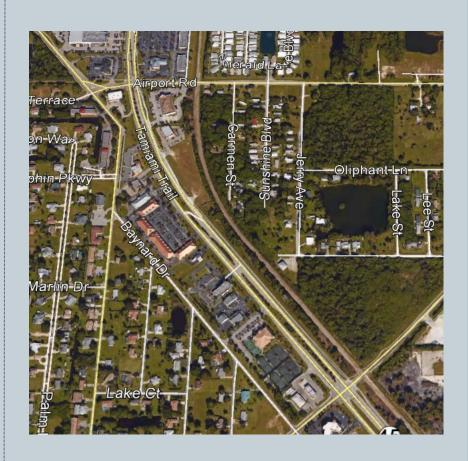
Ponce de Leon Park Redesign

 - Donation of Services by Herston Engineering



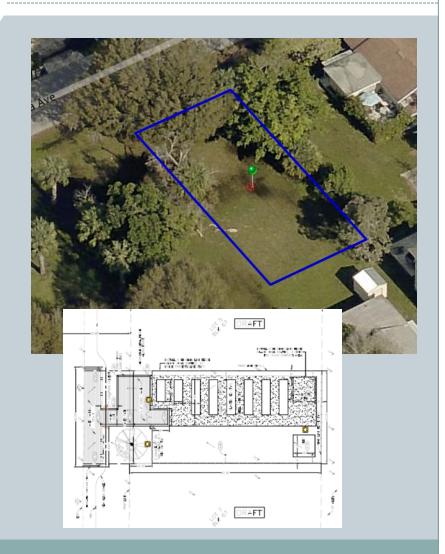
US 41 MURT & Lighting

Fresh Market & Garden

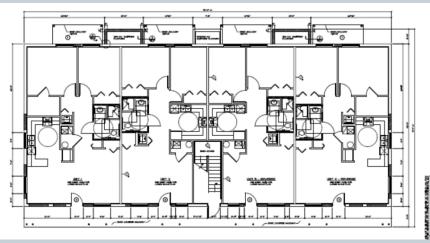
- Construction of fresh market

Drainage Improvements

- Drainage improvements for Corto Andra/Boca Grande area; may include a retention pond bank.
- Data collection and preliminary assessment are underway. Design alternatives will be available February 2017.

Swale Drainage Improvements

- Regrading of drainage swales, based on video observations of standing water after 72 hours for rainfall.
- This will be an ongoing citywide project.
- General Fund

Storm Sewer Reconstruction

- Annual project involving storm drainage pipe lining or replacement of defective pipe.
- Performed on an as-needed basis or for emergency improvements.
- General Fund
 - Project Budget includes carryovers from 2015/16 \$156,541



ADA Curb Ramp Improvements

- ADA Curb Ramp
 Improvements are in
 conjunction with resurfacing
 program where required.
- Anticipated improvements to begin in 2017.
- Sales Tax Funds
 - Project Budget carried over from 2015/16 \$10,866

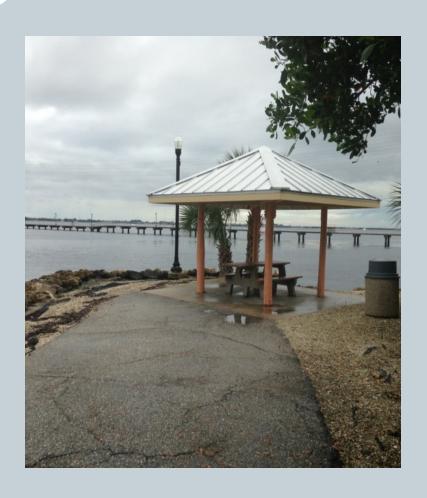


Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDL's)

- City is mandated by FDEP to improve water quality of State water bodies. City is listed on the impaired water body list due to the Peace River and Alligator Creek flowing though City limits.
- Improvements to be made at locations that discharge into the Peace River and Alligator Creek.
- Bi-annual program.
- General Fund
 - Project Budget includes carryovers 2015/16 \$36,755

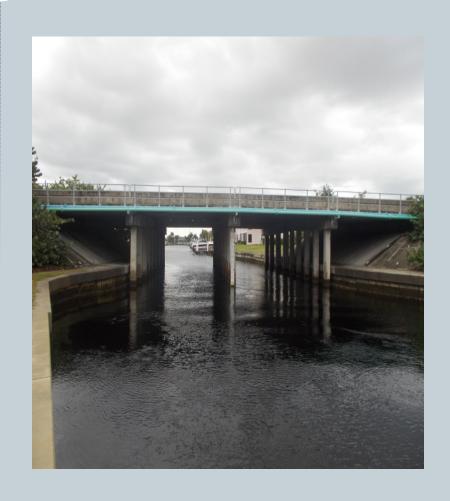
Soil Stabilization at Marina Point

- Replace filter fabric and rip rap stone around the Marina Point and pump house area.
- Anticipated start of project is December 2016.
- CRA Funds
 - Project Budget \$ 10,000



Bridge Repair

- Project is a result of FDOT bridge inspections.
- Biennial Inspections underway. Completion of Inspections will result in work order generation.
- General Fund
 - Project Budget \$39,300



BSI Perimeter Channel Dredging

- Dredging of the narrow portions of the perimeter channel in Burnt Store Isles.
- Permitting is underway with the appropriate agencies.
- BSI Canal Maintenance Fund
 - Project Budget \$565,250



Additional Harbor Access

- Consultant submitted permit application to FDEP.
 Permitting process anticipated to be completed September 2018.
- Consultant working in assessment methodology, with discussion in March/April 2017 timeframe.
- Special Use Fund

Waterway Markers

- Upgrading channel markers at 7 inlet channels in the PGI District to current FWC standards. Replacement of 140 signs and 34 pilings, and addition of 23 pilings.
- Project to begin March 2017

Soil Stabilization for Library Site

- Remove up to 12 feet of soil, sift, and replace bad soils compact to density. City to provide the removal service of organic materials and debris.

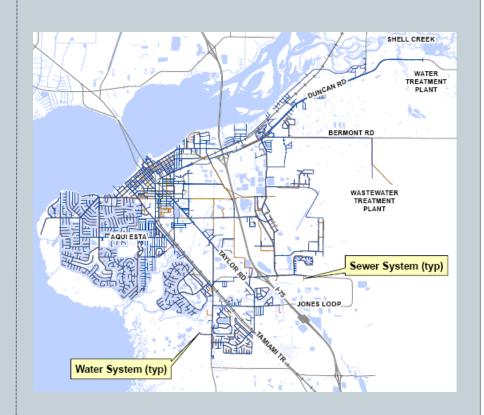
