
Bicycle Etiquette

- Bicycling in general
 - Bicycles are considered vehicles under Florida Law
 - Bicycles are permitted on sidewalks under Florida Law
 - Headlight and taillight is required for operation of a bicycle from dusk till dawn
 - Helmets are required for any rider under 16 years old



- Bicyclists are allowed on all roadways in Florida except where specifically prohibited (like Interstates)
- Bicyclists operating on roadways have all the rights and responsibilities as any other vehicle under Florida Law
- Bicyclists hare the right to occupy the travel lane if the travel lane is not wide enough for the safe passage of both a vehicle and a bicycle
- A vehicle passing a bicycle must give a minimum of 3 feet of clearance to the bicyclist
- A vehicle may legally cross a double yellow line in order to pass a bicycle
- Bicycling on sidewalks and Multi-Use Recreational Trails (Ring Around the City)
 - Bicyclists operating on a walkway has the rights and responsibilities of a pedestrian.
 - Bicyclists must yield the right of way to pedestrians
 - Bicyclists overtaking a pedestrian must provide an audible warning by either:
 - Ringing a bicycle bell
 - Or announcing in in a reasonably loud voice "Passing on your left"
