

CITY WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS REPORT AUGUST 9, 2019

City Manager

- FY 2020 Budget Message The proposed FY 2020 budget message provides information regarding progress of current year strategic plan action items; economic trends on a national, state, regional and local level; budget highlights by fund and department; property tax impact; reserves; and unresolved issues still to be addressed. Previous weekly reports have highlighted pertinent budget action already taken by City Council. Below are some additional information that will aid the community in their evaluation of our proposed service delivery plan:
 - ✓ The Charlotte County Property Appraiser reported that taxable property values increased Citywide by 7.1%, which is the seventh straight year of increasing property values, reversing a previous trend of six straight decreases in overall value.
 - ✓ The Community Redevelopment Area (CRA) experienced a 10.1% increase from previous year property values, the fifth straight year of value increases.
 - ✓ Increased value from new construction, annexations and other adjustments in the City is \$54.2 million, down from \$60.1 million the previous year.
 - ✓ The proposed FY 2020 General Fund Budget, net of ending reserve and an \$8.2 million transfer for a line of credit draw for the PGI Canal Maintenance Fund, totals \$23.2 million, which is \$1.6 million or 7.4% more than the original FY 2019 budget. The cumulative increase in the general fund since FY 2008 is 12.9%, which averages to an approximate 1.1% increase per year.
 - ✓ The proposed millage rate is 3.4337, up from the 3.1969, which was held constant since FY 2014. The City's portion of a residential tax bill, excluding non-ad valorem assessments, is generally 20% or under. The majority of ad-valorem taxes are for services provided to Charlotte County government and Charlotte County School system.
 - ✓ The 291 funded full time equivalent (f.t.e.) position count for FY 2020 has increased by three from the amended count of FY 2019. The positions added: are a dispatcher, a civilian employee development coordinator and community engagement officer in the police department; an EMS training chief in fire department; a change that increases the part-time line & grade inspector in the building division to a full-time engineering technician position that will be funded 50% by the building division to continue to complete that work and 50% from the engineering division; a computer support specialist in the information technology division; and an outreach associate and a research associate in CHNEP funded through grants and contributions. This increase of 7.5 f.t.e. positions was offset by the reduction of 4 temporary f.t.e positions (seawall inspectors and a communications liaison) that were approved for the Hurricane Irma seawall repair project that were budgeted in FY 2019 and not budgeted in FY 2020. The ratio of employees per 100 population is 1.5, down from 1.9 in 2007.

✓ The change in Consumer Price Index (CPI) as reflected in the State "Save Our Homes" Legislation is 1.9%. This means that no matter how high the market value of a homestead property increases, the assessed value can only rise 1.9%.

Property owners will soon receive their TRIM (Truth In Millage Act) notices being sent by the Property Appraiser to all County property owners. - Alligator Creek Waterway Municipal Services Benefit Unit (MSBU) County staff will be recommending that the Alligator Creek Waterway MSBU assessment for the Buckley's Pass parcels be put off for one year due to the delay in construction. In order to accomplish this, the assessment rate will have to be lowered to zero during their Sep. 9, budget public hearing at the Charlotte County Event and Conference Center.
- Citywide Master Plan Draft Presentation Aug. 21 at 5 pm Dover Kohl & Partners will present the Draft Citywide Master Plan to the community at the Charlotte Harbor Events Center. Registration is not required and Punta Gorda stakeholders are welcome.
- Strategic Planning City Council and staff will host a strategic planning session on Aug. 28 at 5 pm at the Punta Gorda Isles Civic Association to gather stakeholder input for the FY2020 Strategic Plan. All community stakeholders are welcome to participate.
- **Buckley's Pass** Payments totaling \$1,905,814.91 have been received for Buckley's Pass through Aug. 8.

Engineering

- Alligator Creek pedestrian bridges along US41 NB-FDOT Right of Way The contractor mobilized to the site and commenced work on Aug. 5. Utility line relocations are occurring. Erosion control measures, Maintenance of traffic devices, survey and layout, clearing and grubbing, utility locates and potholing is taking place. Preparing to construct the crane pad and set pile template. The work area is north and south of the north fork Alligator Creek Bridge. Pedestrians are requested to seek alternate routes.
- Pavement Rejuvenation Pavement rejuvenation continues weather and equipment operations permitting on the following roadways:
 - 1. Cooper St. from Airport Rd. to Taylor Rd.
 - 2. Marion Ave. from Tropicana to DiVinci Dr.
 - 3. Trieste Dr. from Palermo to the cul-de-sac
 - 4. Portofino Dr. from Monaco Dr. to the cul-de-sac

- **Paving Program** Milling and resurfacing has be completed on Ida Ave., Elizabeth St., Coco Plum, Carissa and Philodendron. Striping is pending installation.
- Harborwalk West Area 2a & 2b The project Award Recommendation is being processed for presentation to City Council for approve consideration the Aug. 21 City Council Meeting.
- Harborwalk at Justice Center Boardwalk and Pier at Adrienne St. Five pier pilings have been repaired with epoxy filled jackets at the Adrienne Street Pier near the hospital. Sixteen pier pilings are under repair at the Harborwalk Pier near the Justice Center. The sunken sections of the pier are being lifted as part of the repair. Once the pilings are repaired, limited deck and handrail repairs will also be made.
- Citywide Drainage Swale Regrading To date JRL Underground has completed work at 452 properties totaling 334,800 square feet of grading/sodding. Excavation and grading this week was completed at 7355-7369 and 7376-7390 Schefflera as well as 321-329 W. Virginia. Due to heavy inland rains that have flooded sod fields the contractor has been unable to obtain sod for these streets. The next locations for grading include 417-426 Vitex, 7512-7518 Dracena, 7316-7340 S. Blue Sage
- Goldstein Street Bricking between Marion and Olympia Ave. The paving contractor completed asphalt base which is currently in the curing period. Concrete curb repair is pending early next week. Sand and bricking will be scheduled accordingly.
- **Veterans Park Phase II** Bid opening held Aug. 6. Bids under review and projected for award at the Aug. 21 City Council meeting.

Canal Maintenance

• Bass and Snook Inlet – Beginning the week of Aug. 5 through Aug. 23 (weather permitting), the Bass and Snook Inlet is scheduled to be dredged. The contractor will off load dredge material at the easterly end of Breakers Park and the material will be transported to another location by dump trucks. Boaters are asked to please use caution in this area during construction. • Safety Tip — Outdoor entertaining, cooking on the grill, and spending time with family and friends in the back yard or near the pool all make for great memories that will last forever. However, hosting events such as this creates increased risks for home fires and injuries.



The following safety tips can help ensure everyone takes away happy memories and stays safe:

- ✓ Always have an adult present when there is a portable fire pit burning
- ✓ Use sturdy candle holders that won't tip over
- ✓ Keep children, pets, and anything that can burn at least three feet away from open flames
- ✓ Use battery-operated flameless candles and solar powered patio torches in place of open flame

Some statistics on outdoor entertaining:

- ✓ Outside fire pits/places cause nearly 3,700 grass and brush fires annually
- ✓ Patio heater and fire pit injuries nearly tripled from 2006-2012, rising from 1,330 to 3.608
- ✓ More than half of all candle fires start when things that burn are too close to the candle
- ✓ In 2012, sparklers, fountains and novelties accounted for 25% of emergency room fireworks-related injuries.

- Hardness is a measurement of calcium and magnesium ions naturally occurring in the raw water. Current Condition "moderately hard" – Grains of Hardness 9 ppm – Total hardness 154 ppm
- TDS for Aug. 8 Current 263 ppm, Low 263 ppm, High 459 ppm, Year Avg. 370 ppm

Current Board & Committee Vacancies (Volunteer Appointment Information Form)

 Code Enforcement Board – (Two vacancies) Meets the 4th Wednesday at 9 a.m. in City Council Chambers. Must be City resident. Seven member board with two alternate members. Three year terms – maximum of three terms. Hears and decides alleged violations of the City Code of Ordinances.

- Historic Preservation Advisory Board (One alternate vacancy) Meets the 4th Thursday at 9 a.m. in City Council Chambers. Must be City resident. Seven member board with two alternate members. Three year terms maximum of three terms. Identifies for the City Council historically significant structures and sites that should be considered for designation as a "Local Historic Landmark" or be nominated for listing on the Florida Master Site File and the National Register of Historic Places. Makes recommendations of the policies for the protection of historically significant structures and sites. Makes recommendations to staff with regard to certificates of appropriateness for any demolition, variance, sign or relocation of structures. Promotes public awareness of historic archaeological preservation and its community benefits.
- Punta Gorda Housing Authority (One resident Commissioner vacancy) Meets the third Thursday at 8:30 a.m. at the PGHA Community Room, 340 Gulf Breeze Avenue, Punta Gorda. Must be a resident of Charlotte County. At least one commissioner shall reside within the Housing Authority's jurisdiction and receive rent subsidy through a program administered by the Authority.
